**SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.**

**BOROUGH OF WOLVERHAMPTON.**

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton have made application to the Minister of Health for an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940, to extend by three years the period limited by sub-section (2) of section 20 of the Wolverhampton Corporation Act, 1936, for the construction of the waterworks numbered 1, 2, 3, 4 and 7 respectively, authorised by section 18 of the said local Act.

**SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.**

**COUNTY BOROUGH OF WALSALL.**
