**Hague, June 29 N. S.** The Directors of the East-India Company have received Advice, that eight Ships belonging to the said Company, which sailed from Batavia on the 25th of November last, are arrived on our Coasts. A Placet was Published this day, to cry down in these Provinces the Strivers lately Coined in Brabant. Engineer-General Coehorne is gone from hence to view the Fortifications of several of our Frontier Towns.

**Paris, June 30. N. S.** A Courier is arriv'd here from the Prince of Monaco, the French Ambassador at Rome writes, that Cardinal Malabranca being lately dead, and a third Capriccio being made, the Pope has made a Promotion in favour of the Crown; The Bishop of Passaw at the Recommendation of the Emperor; the Archbishop of Paris for France; and Don Borja, Canon of Tolosa at the Recommendation of Spain. The Cardinal of Doullin has resign'd his Place of Canon of Strasbourg. The King has given Leave to Melchor, one of the Spanish and other Foreign Coats, which were Cried down by his Edict of the 14th of March last. Several Regiments of Foot are ordered to march towards Provence. They write from Toulon, that the Squadron lately sent out there is to be composed by 5 Men of War. The Letters from Marsailles lay, Orders are given for sending out 12 Gallies, which are to be commanded by the Bailly of Nantua. There are Letters from the West-Indies of the 27th of February last, which give an Account, That the Settlement which the French intend to make near the Mouth of the River Mississippi is not a fleeting expedient, Monsieur d'Abbeville, who had the Management of that Design, was returning home.

**Dale, June 22.** The *Archangel*, Capt. *Whately*, the *King*, Capt. *Warren*, and three other Merchant Ships, are arriv'd in the Downs from Barbadoes; the *Mary*, Capt. *Gill*, from New-York; the *Expedition*, Capt. *Store*, from Nevis; and the *Good-Sped*, Capt. *Balfon*, from New-England. There are at present in the Downs, the *Lucretia*, Capt. *Bull* Commander, and the *Anna*, Capt. *Tanner*, bound to Jamaica, and several other outward-bound Merchant Ships.

**Westminster, June 20.** The Parliament met this day, and was further Prorogued to the First Day of August next.
