Tarin, July 3. N. S.

Onlieur Phelippeaux arrived here some days ago from France with the Chara-A fter of Ambassador Extraordinary; He hashed a Private Audience of the Duke of Savoy, and still continues incognito. The Duke intends flortly to go to his House at the Venerie, where he will find the remaining part of the Summer Senson. One Gazano, an Inhabitant of Mondowi, who was formerly Banished from the Duke of Saon's Dominions for several Crimes, returned huely to Mondowi, and perswaded 800 of the Inhabitants to take up Arms against their Prince; but two Regiments of Foot were sent thither, who foon dispersed them.

Milm, July 7. The Prince of Vaudemon: has received a Commission from the King of Spain, to be Governor-General of this Dutchy for 3 years longer; Upon which he has been Complimented by the Senate, the several Courts of Justice, and other Persons of Quality. He intends to go in aday or two to Final to view the Fortifications of that Place, and give Orders for the necessary Repairs to be made there. They write from Mantag, that the Duke and Dutchess of Parma had passed by there going to St. Maurice in Switzerland to use the Waters of that Place, and that they were splendidly entertained by the Duke of Maniu, who ordered the Marquis de Bereita, his Secierary, to conduct them in their Journey through

Mittam, July 12. The Saxon Infantry (which came by Sea to Memil) arrived the 11th Instant with several Pieces of Cannon in their Camp near Rigs; They will need fome time to refresh themlives after so hard a March as they have had. The King of Poland is expected here the 15th Infant. The Sacons talk of repassing the Dwina; But the Swedes have so well fortified Lutzenholme, the only Place where they can go over the River, that their Passage will be very difficult.

Warfaw, July 8. The King of Poland contihues his Journey to Livonia through Lithuania, as well to endeavour to reconcile the Differences betwen the Houses of Sapieha and Oginiky, as to prevail with the Great General and Nobility of that Dutchy to affift him with a greater number of Forces in his Enterprize against the Swedes in Livenia. The Sieur Beuchling (who is made Great Chancellor of Saxony upon the Refignation of the Prince of Sane-Zeits Bilhop of Raab) went this day to Dresden, with Orders to send a consiemble Sum of Money to Livonia for the Service of the Saxon Forces. Prince Sapieba, fecond Son to the Great General of Lithuania, is made a Linemant-General, and tis faid hie is ordered by the King to the Impethe King to go on some Commission to the Imperial Court. Monsieur Dutteron, Envoy from France, and Main Court of the Vines. ad Major General Tramp, Envoy from the King of Damark, are gone to attend the King. Erroy from the Cham of Tartary is returned home. Major General Denbeff has taken a Review of 400 Men he lately raised in and about this City, and they are by are to march in few days to the Camp in Li-The Duke de Croy, with the Officers he

has brought with him from Vienna, continue hereexpecting divers other Officers from Germany, after whole arrival they will go together to the Saxon Army.

Copenhagen, July 20. The Swedish Fleet having with much difficulty passed the Flats between the Isle of Saltholm and the Coast of Schonen, they joined the English and Dutch Squadrons near Landscroon, and anchored in a Line between that Place and the Isle of Ween; And they are since come nearer to the Danish Fleet, which continues in our Road. The English and Dutch lie now at Anchor at a little distance from the Swedes. The 4000

Men expected from Nerway are arrived.

Vienna, July 14. The Emperor's Journey to Newstat is put off till the middle of the next Month, about which time the Elector Palatine is expected at the Imperial Court. The Duke of Pareli, Ambassador from Span, has had a Private Audience of the Emperor, and is preparing for

his Publick Entry and Audience.
Francfort, July 22. The Elector Palatine is come to Manheim, where he took a Review of his Forces that are drawn together near that Place, and he intends to be to morrow at Heydelberg, and in few days to continue his Journey to the Imperial Court. He had an Interview at Werms with the Great Master of the Teutonick Order, his Brother. Monsieur d'Ibberville, Envoy from France, having performed his Commission to the Elector of Triers

and the Elector Palatine, is returned to Mentz. Gell, July 21. The Sauon Troops lately put into the Service of Denmark, having advanced on the 18th Instant within a small distance of this Place, they put the Neighbouring Country under Contribution, ordering them to pay the same in 8 hours on pain of Military Execution; But before this time was expired, they received Advice that the Troops of Hanover and Cell were drawn together and marching towards them, whereupon they immediately retired, and attempted to pals through the Territories of the Duke of Wolfens buttel, but were refused Passage. This put the Saxons under great Consternation, who rather expected that the Troops of Wolfembuttel would have joined them; So they retired by the way of Breitstadt and Gersdorf, and are marching back to Saxony in much disorder. The Country People have taken about 40 of the Saxens, and killed about 60; The Forces of Lunenburgh march after the Saxons, but the latter have got so far before them by the great hast they have made, that the Lunerburghers will not be able to get up with them. In the mean time General Ohr, who Commands the Forces of Lunenburgh, has fent an Officer to the Duke of Wolfembuttel, to return him thanks for his Friendship to the Elector of Hanover and the Duke of Gell on this occasion.

Hamburgh, July 23. After several Conferences and Negociations between the Ministers of the Princes Mediators, and the Parties concerned in the Affair of Holstein, the following Articles are faid to be concluded and agreed on;
