"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to make special provision for the grant of discharge gratuities to certian Naval ratings on regular engagements:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to sanction the following arrangements:—

"A gratuity of fr for each completed year of a man's service on a Continuous Service engagement or on the active service portion of a Special Service engagement (counting any final uncompleted year as a full year) shall be paid at our discretion to men, or to their estates, who

"II. Are invalided whilst so serving otherwise than by their own negligence or default, as an alternative to any gratuity payable under Order in Council of 6th February, 1922, Schedule I (Service Element) (b) and Schedule II (b), where more favourable.

"III. Are discharged on completion of their continuous Service engagement (or active service portion of Special Service engagement) if not reengaged and not discharged to pensions provided that they enrol in the Royal Fleet Reserve, or have applied to re-engage, or to enrol in the Royal Fleet Reserve, but have been refused on medical grounds or through lack of vacancies.

"The gratuity will not be payable to:—

"A. Men discharged to pension, or in receipt.

of pension. B. Men discharged by purchase or free at own request, even if they enrol in the Royal Fleet

"C. Men discharged unsuitable, Services No Longer Required as fraudulent entries, or otherwise on disciplinary grounds.

"D. Men refused re-engagement, or enrolment in the Royal Fleet Reserve, on account of unsatisfactory conduct or adverse recommendation.

"E. Men declining re-engagement, or enrolment in the Royal Fleet Reserve.

"E Man discharged from their engagements."

"F. Men discharged from their engagements for the purpose of being granted Warrants or Commissions.

" General.

"(a) Service allowed to count for gratuity shall be assessed by the same rules as service allowed to count for pension by King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

"(b) Where men who, after refusing to enrol in the Royal Fleet Reserve, on termination of active service engagement are subsequently accepted for enrolment within one year of discharge, gratuity in respect of Naval or Royal Marine Service will be parable. be payable.

"(c) Men, who, after being awarded a gratuity, reenter on an engagement to complete time for pension will be required to refund the gratuity as a condition of re-entry; but if during their second engagement they are discharged in circumstances which qualify them for a gratuity, time served under both engagements will count.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, and of the Reverend George Halstead Greenfield, incumbent of the benefice of Saint John, Brandon (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that so soon as conveniently may be after the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the remaining structure of the said Church of Saint Catherine, Sleetburn, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto, shall be disposed of by us either by sale, in which case the net proceeds shall be appropriated towards the cost of acquiring a site approved by us as suitable for the substituted Church hereinbefore referred to, or by exchange thereof for a site for the said substituted Church."
