Earis, May 11. The Encampment of His Majefties forces atas conflaes is for fome ime deferred, that fo a good order may be iaken for their Enterrainment, and to jecure them f.om thpt Infection, which"tis feared may ag in increale with the hats of the Summer.
'T is faid His Majefty has given Order for Bills of Exchiange forthe fumme of 400 thouiand Crowns, to be fent to the Bithup of Befiers bis Ambafladont in Poland, to be emploiced for the auvantage of the French Iqrereft in that E'ettion.

From Thoulon wed are informed of the lare arrival in that Road of a thip from Candia, which came thence on the 7 th of the latt moneth, the Malter of the Veffel giving this account of the affaius of the Sege; that the Town continues io $\$$.fend it felf with extraordinary courage and $\mathbf{v a}$ lour"againts the 'Turks, wo which they are encouraged by the Examplen and Condnct of the Matquifs de St. Axdre Mantbran, who is perfectity recovered from his wounds; that the Garrifon. within the Town confilts of abous 8600 able Coldiers, an that the venerians Fleet was able upon any occaition to affint them with 6000 mote, without any great prejudice to themielyes; and, that the whole Army of the Turks before the Town is ngt conceived to exceed the number of twenty thoufand mers, that thofe lay well fortified in their Trenches, but mapde their moft conEderable attempts upon the Bulwark St. Andre, again which they had with much labour raifed a high Mount, on the top whereof they had made a Battery, on which they had planted two Guns of extraordinary bignes, with which and their fmall fhot they fired continually upon the Town; by verue whereof they were encquraged to make frequent alfaules upon the Bulwark, wherein they had made a confiderable breach, on which they had twice lodged themfelves: but by the Mines and Valour of the befieged, were beaten off with great flaughter; farther affirming that the befieged being fnfinitely annoyed by the faid Mount, had with much labour and diligence made two Mines znder it, fpringing the frit of them of 150 Brrels, of Ponder, with fuch fuccefs, that the two Guns were buried in the ruins of the Batte. $y$; in which were allo killed 800 Turks, and about 400 wourded; after which, the Turks endeavored fo reftore and repair again their Battery y and had planted more Guns upon it ; but then the befieged firing the fecond Mine, wholly ruined the Mount, and freed them 4 Çlves from that great annoyance, with a lofs of a great number of the Turks.

He farther confirms to us the news, that the Venetian Ambaffadour having difplenfed the Vifier, utenly sefufing upon any Terms or Propofals for a Peace, to give up the Town, was confined to his Lodging in Canes, and had a ftritt Gard fer upon him.

Fron Marfeilles shey tell us of the arrival of the thred thips belonging to the lately fitablifine Levant-Gompany, richly laden, who came from smirna in compspy with one Genouefe Merchant thip, and under the $\mathrm{C}_{5}$ aduch of one of this Msj<Atics Mce of Waro companded by Craptain Lar-
fon : and that upon their way they were met by 7 Corfairs of Tripoly, who prepared to atcempt them, but the Man rof War coming up ; and m.king iteady to oppole them Fthey defilted from sheir purpoie, eand left th.mo $t 9$ purfue their Voyage : the Man of War having conducted them our of all dangere, is failed for $\delta$ mivint tofecure fome other of our Merchnot thips on their return.

From Thoulon we arefarther advifed, that the Dukg de Beaufoy continuing his diligence tan hattening out the Fleers has putan Embargo upon all the French Merchane fhips in that and other Porrs of Provence, prefing them co take aboard them Provilions and Ammunition, and to attend the Ffecti in their Expedition for Gandia; that the Gallies will be fuddenly fried up and ready to pus to fea; the grear want of Gaves being lupplyed by fea-men, who freely ofer tifem'fefves to the fervice, to that only one Gally remains now to be Equis ped and furnifhed.

From the Netherlands they write, that naar 40000 Labourers are in feveral pares of his Maje ties New Conquefs empldyed in the Fortificarions, to whom a Propofition hids beén lately made by His Majetties Order, that Luch of them as thall offer themfelves to bis fervice in cole of a War, Chatl be affired of she fame pay as is now given, which is much more then what is ufually allowed to the ordinary foldiers;: and that tare thall be taken to pay them weekly; nor thall they be obliged to conctiont in the fervice longer then for one Summer, which propofal 'tis faid is accepted by the greateft patt of them.

Hull, Mray 2. This laft week failed hence one flip of Ropzerdem laden with Lead, and Cloth homewards bound:'

On Friday laft pat to fea the George and the Merctiants adventure of this place laden with Cloth, incerding for Hamburgh. Several Danifh fhips are here'arived from Norroay, and many ihips piying up and down upon the Coalts. ${ }^{\text {a }}$
