were blown away. Nevertheless he kept up a continuous and accurate fire throughout the action, and even when the attacking aircraft withdrew refused to leave his action station until his ship reached harbour. He was then discovered helping the other wounded until, on the point of collapse, he was himself ordered on to a stretcher.

His dauntless courage throughout this action was an inspiration to all who were

present.
