Lisbon, Aug. 3. N. S.

HE Count de Wallenstein, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had his first Private Audience of the King of Pertusit on the 27th Instant. The Cardinal de Souza was dangerously ill last week, and received the Estime Unction, but he is since much better. On the 18th Instant the Duke de Cadaval took a Review in the Plain of Pedroiss of all the Forces, both Hosse and Foot, that are quartered in and about this Place, which made a very good Appunce. Six Men of War are sitted out to the part of the Ships of Barbary, several of the having lately been seen on this Coast.

Mudrid, Aug. 14. The King of Spain having found great benefit in his Health from the Air of the Escarial the last time he was there, has resolved to return to that Place as soon as the great heat of the Weather is over. Several Councils have been held by Cardinal Porcecurrere, about increasing the Spanish Fleet, with the Management of which Affair he is chiefly entrusted; And the Ministers at this Court have likewise been several times in Conference with the Marquis of Leganez, (who is charged with the Care of the Land-Forces of this Kingdom) upon the Measures to be taken, in order to put them upon a better Foot than they are at present.

Rome, Aug. 17. The Pope is so ill, that his Physicians have acquainted him, that they think him to be in a very dangerous condition. Illness of the Pope's has occasioned the putting off the Confistory, in which 'tis said he intended to conser the Office of Dean of the College of Cardinals upon the Cardinal de Bouillon; However the Pope has already granted him by a Brief the Bihopricks of Oftia and Velleiry, which are always anexed to that Dignity; and he has been Complimented thereupon by all the Cardinals, and particularly by Cardinal Spada, First Minister of State at this Court. The Cardinals are very busy State at this Court. The Cardinals are very busy in making Parties against the next Conclave; 'Tis said, there will be a great many Pretenders to the Popedom, but that thos: who in all appearance will stand the fairest, are of the old Cardinals, Carpigna, Durazzo, and Panciatici; and of the new, Morigia, Norres, and Rodolowick.

From the King of Poland's Camp before Riga, Aug. 19. We began yesterday to Bombard the City of Riga, sing several Bombs from a Battery in the Kober Schans, but they did not reach the Town, being at too great a distance; We are now raising other Batteries, and Orders are given for bringing our heavy Cannon over the River, the Bridge of Boats at Luzenbolme being sinished. The Belieged have made several Retrenchments without the Town, and planted Cannon there to hinder us from bringing our Batteries near enough for the Bombs to take effect. 'Tis said, Count Welling with the Forces under his Command, upon Advice that a Body of Swedish Forces was arrived at Revell, is marched that way to join them.

An Express is passed through this flice, being sent from Holst-in to the King of Poland with the News, that the Trenty for accommodating the Discretce between the King of Denmark and the Duke of Hillern was in effect concluded. Our Advices from the King of Polana's Camp in Livonia say, the Saxons had thrown several Bombs into the Town of Riga, but without any effect, their Batteries being too say off and that they were raising other Batteries, and expected

their heavy Artillery, being refolved to go on with the Bomburding. They write from Riga, that the Place is in a very good condition of Detence, the Garrison very numerous, and well provided with all Necessaries, and that the Loss which the Swidyb Forces, commanded by Count Westing, sustained in their late Retreat, is not near so great as the Sexons reported it to be. The Seates of Courland are assembled here, and have agreed to furnish 30000 Last of Cour, and as many of Oats, for the use of the King of Poland's Ferces, but greater Supplies are demanded of them, which they feem very unwilling to grant.

Dantzick, August 25. The Cardinal Primate is still here, and continues his Conferences with the Deputies of our Senate, which 'tis said relate to the Satisfaction demanded from this City by the Most Christian King, on account of what passed while Monsieur Du Bart's Squadron lay before this place. The Czar of Muscocy has writ to the Senate of Poland, to let them know, That he does not intend to take any Part in the War against Sweden. The Letters from the King of Poland's Camp in Livenia say, they had railed their Batteries, and were going to Bombaid Riga.

Copenhagen, Aug. 28. On the 23d Instant the Count of Raventlau, one of the King of Denmark's Countellors, waited upon the King of Sweden in his Camp near Rundflieg. The next day Count Wride, and another of the King of Sweden's Ministers, came hither from the Swedish Camp to adjust divers Matters about the said King's withdrawing his Forces out of this Island; Monsieur Krabbe and the Sieur Ola Honssen were appointed to confer with them on the part of the King of Denmark; They had yesterday a Conserence together, and another this day; And every thing being agreed on, the Transport of the Swedilb Forces is to be begun on the 3 ift Instant. The Danes are to furnish them for this purpose with several small Vessels, and an Embargo is therefore laid on all the Vessels in this Port. The Swedish Commissary-General Adberstein came hither the 24th Instant, to agree about the Provisions and Forrage to be furnished for the Swedish Forces during their stay in Zeeland, and the not day divers Wagons were fent to the Swedish Camp with Provisions. On the 25th Instant the King of Sweden took a Review of his Army, which according to the Swedish Muster-Rolls consists in 4000 Horse and 8000 Foot, besides 3000 Horses belonging to the King, the Officers, and the Baggage; and 'tis faid, part of these Forces will be sent to Livonia. The King of Sweden has fent Orders to countermand the Transport of 3000 Men from Gottembourg to Tonning n, if they he not already gone. The Forces which the Danes affembled to oppose the King of Smeden are encamped near this City, and as soon as the Smedes are withdrawn out of this Country, they will return to their Quarters, and the greatest part of them consisting of Milicia, will be discharged and sent home. Danish Fleet lies at Anchor in our Road, and will be laid up as foon as the English and Dutch, and the Smedish Pleets, are failed home; The former are anchored off the Isle of Wien, and are taking in Provisions in order to their departure. The Smedish Fleet lies on the Coast of Smeden, between

Landferson and Malmos.

Hambergh, Aug. 21. The Armies in Holfsem are separated; the King of Denmark's sources are returning to heir Quirters, and the Smed sh Forces which were there are marching part to Bromen, and part to Pomeren. The Dutch Intantia repassed the Eide yesterday, and their Holfs will pass this River to day, and will march home through the Country of Limitager.
