Lisbon, Aug. 17. N. S.

Orders are sent to all the Troops quarter'd hereabouts to repair to the Plain of *Padroas*, where the King intends to review them, after which they will be sent back to their respective Quarters. The Count of *Waldstein*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had this week Publick Audience of the King, as likewise of the Queen-Dowager of England, and the Prince Royal of Portugal. Five Frigats are lately sail'd out of this Port to cruise against the Ships of *Barbary*. 'Tis said, a Squadron will be sent with Supplies of Men and Ammunition to the *Portuguezes*, on the Coast of *Zanguebar*, to enable them to retake *Mombaza* from the *Arabs*, this Fortreis being of considerable Advantage to our Navigation in those Parts.

Madrid, Aug. 26. The King of *Spain* continues in very good Health, and went on the 21st Instant with the Queen to pay his Devotions in the Church, dedicated to our Lady of *Atobe*, for his Recovery from the Indisposition he had about a fortnight ago. 'Tis said, their Majesties will go to the *Escorial* towards the middle of the next Month, and the necessary Preparations are making for this Journey. Monsieur *Schonemberg* had yesterday Publick Audiences of the King and Queen, being conducted in the King's Coach by *Don Carlos de Castille*, Introdutor of Ambassadors, and he has received Visits of Ceremony from the Foreign Ministers at this Court. The Cardinal *Borgia* went some days ago with a splendid Retinue to Court, and paid his Respects to the King and Queen on the occasion of his Promotion. Signior *Aguaviva*, the Pope's Nuncio, arriv'd here the 19th Instant; Cardinal *Archinto*, who retir'd here with the same Character, has taken his Audiences of Leave, and intends in few days to set out from hence on his return to *Rome*. Count *de Hayach*, the Emperor's Ambassador, had an Audience of the King two days ago; His Lady intends shortly to return to *Vicenna*. The Ministers at this Court continue to meet frequently together, to consult about encreasing our Forces both at Sea and Land, and have begun to put in execution the King's Orders for suppressing of Pensions and unnecessary Offices, whereby they hope to raise the Sums of Money required for this Service. All the Officers that are in Town have received Orders to repair to their respective Commands. Letters from *Cadiz* say, one of the *Spanish* Galeons, which was to have been Vice-

Admiral of the Flota design'd for the *West-Indies*, was lately burnt by Accident, which Loss is valued at about 50000 Pieces of Eight. The *Spaniards* have lately bought two Merchant Ships, which will be sent with the Squadron of Men of War that are fitted out there to the *West-Indies*, to carry Provisions and Ammunition for the use of the *Spanish* Forces in those Parts. The *French* Squadron commanded by the Marquis *de Nesmond*, consisting of 14 Men of War and 2 Fireships, is still at *Cadiz*, and Monsieur *Pointi* with his Squadron cruizes off the Coast of *Barbary*. The last Advices from *Ceuta*, dated the 6th Instant, give an Account, That the *Moors* have lately thrown several Bombs into the Place, but without doing any Damage; and that the Besieged continued by their Salleys and Mines to gain ground of the Enemy. The King of *Morocco's* Army before this Place is said to be 12000 strong, but most Militia; beside which the *Moors* have 3000 Men at *Tetuan*, and 6000 at *Tangier*, to guard their Coasts.

Messina, Aug. 9. The *Mermaid* Gally, which lately came from *England*; sail'd this Evening for *Smyrna*. There are at present in this Port, the *Leghorn* Gally bound to *Scanderoun*, the *May* to *Smyrna*, and the *William and Ann* to *London*.

Rome, August 28. The Pope continues very weak. He desired yesterday to be removed to the Chamber, where Pope *Innocent XI.* died, who was his Patron and Benefactor, and made him a Cardinal; But his Physicians perswaded him against it, as being extream dangerous to one in his condition, but this morning he would not be denied, and was removed accordingly, which 'tis thought may hasten his death. The Cardinals and Foreign Ministers continue very busy in making Parties, and strengthening their Interests against the next Conclave, and several Cardinals are already discour'd of as likely to come in Competition for the Popedom.

Leghorne, August 29. Letters from *Tunis* give an account, That in the beginning of *June* last the Bey of *Tunis* at the Head of an Army of 35000 Men, with a Train of Artillery of 35 Pieces of Cannon, march'd into the Kingdom of *Algiers*, and set down before *Constantina* one of their principal Cities, where he was joined by 1500 Horse sent to him by the Bey of *Tripoly*. The *Algerines* assembled all the force they could in order to relieve the Place, but they were defeated by the *Tunisians*, who continued the Siege, and had reduced the Place to the last Extremity; They had besieg'd also the Town of *Bona*. And they write from *Algiers*, that the above-mentioned Defeat of the

Algerine Forces had put their Affairs into a very great Confusion, and that the Dey *Hassan* had thereupon quitted the Government, and *Arche Mustapha* was chosen Dey in his place, who was endeavouring to assemble a Body of Forces to make Head against the Bey of *Tunis*; And that which perplexes the *Algerines* the more, is that they are engaged at the same time in a War against the King of *Morocco*.

Milan, August 30. Count *Carlo Archinto*, Nephew of the Cardinal *Archinto* Arch-Bishop of this Place, has received from *Spain* the Order of the *Golden-Fleece*, upon which he has been Complimented by all the Persons of Quality in Town. Don *Isidoro Cosado* is appointed by the King of *Spain* to be his Envoy to the Duke of *Mantua*, and the Count of *Vailate* and the Marquis of *Patigne* to go with the same Character to the Courts of *Parma* and *Modena*, and they have received their Dispatches from the Prince of *Vaudemont* our Governor, and will be going in few days to their several Stations.

Turin, Aug. 31. The Duke of *Savoy* continues at his Houle at the *Venerie*. Orders are given for filling the Magazines with Provisions, and remounting our Cavalry. A Dispute lately happened between the Archbishop and the Magistrates of this Place, concerning the Privileges of the Church; upon which the Archbishop having published a Monitory, ordering several Persons to appear before him on pain of Excommunication, the Senate of this City has made a Decree, forbidding the said Persons to appear on pain of Confiscation of all their Personal Estates, and enjoining the said Archbishop to withdraw his Monitory, and all Bishops and others of the Clergy not to assist or countenance him in these Proceedings, on the like Penalties.

Mittaw, Aug. 28. The Advices, that a strong Body of *Swedes* is marched from *Finland* to join the Forces commanded by Count *Welling*, and that considerable Succours are coming by Sea from *Sweden*, seem to have determined the King of *Poland* to lay aside the Thoughts of formally besieging the Town of *Riga*, and to attempt the Place by a Bombardment; For this purpose several Batteries are prepared, but the heavy Cannon and Mortars are not yet arrived. In the mean time the Besieged have taken all the necessary Precautions to prevent the Effect of the Bombs; and they have planted several Pieces of Cannon on the Works they lately made without the Town, with which they ply the *Saxons* very warmly, and have killed divers of their Men.

Esseneur, Sept. 7. The *Swedish* Forces which lately landed in *Zeeland*, are all returned to *Schonen*. The King of *Sweden* went from this Place on the third Instant in an open Boat, and landed at *Helsingburg*, and went the next day to *Christianstadt*; He has given Orders for making a Transport of 8 or 9000 Men to *Livonia*. The *Swedish* Fleet continues at Anchor near the Island of *Ween* waiting for a fair Wind to return to *Careefroone*, and after they are sailed, the *English* and *Dutch* Squadrons will likewise leave the *Sound*, and return home.

Frankfort, Sept. 9. The Diet of the Circle of the *Upper Rhine* is assembled to consider of several Matters. The Great Master of the *Teutonic* Order is shortly expected here from *Marienburg*. They write from *Heydelberg* that Prepa-

rations are making there for the Reception of the Elector and Electores Palatine, who intend to come and pass a few days in their journey at their return from *Vienna*. Several Regiments of his Electoral Highnesses Forces are employed in repairing the Fortifications of *Heidelberg*, and another Detachment are at work rebuilding those of *Manheim*.

Cologne, Sept. 10. N.S. The Elector of *Cologne* returned yesterday from *Kevelaer* to *Bonn*. The Diet of this Electorate is assembled at *Bonn* to consider of the Means to raise the Supplies demanded of them by his Electoral Highness. They write from *Dusseldorp*, that the Elector and Electores Palatine are expected there by the 9th of the next Month from *Vienna*.

The Letters from Holland of Friday last are not yet arrived.

Plimouth, Sept. 8. The Providence of *London*, *Richard Murphey* Master, bound to *Virginia*, and the *Pager* Frigate, *John Coles* Commander, bound to *Guinea*, put into this Port the 5th Instant; yesterday sailed from hence, the *Southampton* Galley of *Southampton*, *William Black* Matter, bound home from *Viana*.

Bristol, Sept. 9. Yesterday came in here, the *Unity* of this Port, *John Watts* Commander, from *Jamaca*; the *John Sloop* from *Neon*; and the *Unity* of *Bridgewater*, *John Hooper* Matter, from *Barbadoes*.
