Letters from the Camp be-fore Riga give an Account, that the Negociations carried on by the French, and other Foreign Ministers, for adjusting Matters between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, feem to be in a very good way, and that the King of Poland, in compliance with the pressing Instances of the said Ministers, has wholly laid aside his Design of Ecmbarding Riga, and ordered the Batteries to be demolished, and the heavy Artillery to be fent back hickor.
