King of Great Britain. The Ratifications are expeted in a little time from the Courts of England and Sweden.

Hague, May 18. The 15th instant the States of Holand met again in the usual place for their Assembly. The Deputies from Zealand are also arrived here, and may speedily enter again into Conserence for the adjusting all assirs in dispute with that Province.

The Constable of Castille has lately returned the States General an Answer to a Letter of theirs on the behalf of the Prince of Orange, promising to use his endeavour to procure him satisfaction in the payment of the moneys due to him from Spain; since which the States have wrote him a second Letter, pressing for satisfaction upon the persons taken and committed upon the Riot at Oudeman; desiring that the two prisoners which are in his power and were committed to prison as Complices in that C. ime, may be sent to them, that so they may proceed against them according to their demerits.

It has been lately ordered, that the Heer Heinsius our Resident at Stockholms, be sent from thence into Musco-vy, with instructions to mediate for the composure of all differences between the King of Swedeland and the Grear Duke; of which notice has been given to the Heers Apleboome and Mureshal the Swedish Ministers.

A ship lately arriving upon the Coasts of Holland from Majorca, informs us, that the same Men of War which engaged with the Corlairs of Algiers within the Streights, (in which dispute Vander Zaen was killed) had since taken in amongst some other Corlairs of the same place, between the Cape St. Vincent and Portugal, and that several broadfides were seen to have passed between them, but no account is as yergiven of their st coess.

From Embden the Magistrates of that City have written to the Estates to inform them, that the Bishop of Munster has lately threatned them with force, pretending that the Dutchess of East-Fristand had denied passage to some Boats lasten with Oats for his fervice, and that the Customs settled by him at Bourtang apon his last Invasion, were not paid him as he expected; which Lotter has been since committed to the Examination of Commissioners, who are to make their reports.

The Heer Nicholas Verschoot, formerly a Captain in Brasille, and since of a Troop of Horse here, is ordered to command the Man of War whereon Captain Vander Zaen Was lately killed.

The States have ordered a confiderable Present to be made to Admiral Adelaser the Danish Envoye, in confideration of the great pains he has taken about the measuring of such ships as are to trade upon the Coasts of Norway and in the Sounds.

- Paris, May 18. On Wednelday last His Majesty was pleased to visit his Camp within two Leagues of St. Germains, where he dined 5 preparations are there making for their exercise, and a Fort railed which is to be attacqued of ter the method used in Wat. The sudden death of four perfons on the same day at the Camp, gives us great apprehensions of the revival of the Contagion, and may shorten the time allotted for their encampment.

From Portugal we have Letters which advise of the arrival at Lisbanne of a ship from the West-Indies informing that the Count d'Estrees had with 5 men of War attacked Hispaniola, where he landed his forces, and with the assistance of 800 Boucaniers had made himself Master of Santo Domingo, turning out the Spanish Garrison, of which we expect a farther confirmation.

The same Letters inform us that the Count de Prado, acsigned Ambassador from that Crown to the Count of Rome embarked and put to sea from Lisbonne the 28th past with three men of War of 50 Guns apiece, which after his atrival are to be at the Popes service to be employed to help to transport the succors designed for Candia.

On Sunday next the Chancellor goes from hence to St. Germains, and is to be followed thither by the Procurator

General of the Parliament, to define His Majesty that he would be pleased to appoint a day whereon the Parliament might attend him with their Remonstrance upon the late Edict, in which they desire some miligation, as being severely penned against their priviledges.

From Thousen we are advited, that 13 of His Majesties Gallies are already put to sea, that several ships are there arrived from Brest and Rochette, and that Monsieur de Beaufort intended to embark himself by the end of this Moneth, and would depart with the first fair wind on his expedition for the Levant.

The Arch-Bithop of Thoulouse has lately written to Monfieur de Lionne, and to the Popes Nuncio, complaining of the great encrease of Jansenisme a ichin his Dioces, as well as in other parts of France, it being publickly preached in their Pulpius and Audicries, desiring some speedy course may be taken for the suppression of it before the Opinion shall have received too great a growth.

Monsieur de Louvo; has pressed Don Hieronimo Quignones for the Constable of Castille's Answer to the Demand sometime since made, for the restoring of the Boats
laden with Coals passing into some of the French late Conquests, and for suppression of the Customs, and the Office
erected by them for such Merchandizes as pass into or come
sion any of the owns of the said late Conquests. The
Spaniards on the other side insist with as much earnestness
and as little success, for the Revocation of the Placards which
are every where putting in execution for the Sequestration
of such persons as sive from their Estates, which lie under
the French Jurisdiction.

Letters from Spain affure us of the perfect health of the young King, who has lately for five or fix dayes together appeared publickly in the Streets in Coach, on Horsback, and on Foot; all things continue peaceable in that Court and Kingdom, and the Grandees obedient to the Queen Regent, 'Tis believed that Don Juan may in little time in person enter upon the Government of the Metherlands.

From Brussells we are told, that the Constable of Cafille with the Count Marsin and other Officers intend suddenly to give a Visil to all or the most considerable places of Flanders, to acquaint themselves with the true state
of all their affairs.

This day Monsieur de Louvey departs from hence by his Majesties Orders to visit his late Conquests and other places upon the Frontiers.

London, May 12. Yesterday being the 12th instant, the three Troops of His Majesties Horse Guards, and 7 of the Regiment of Guards commanded by the Barl of Oxford, with 14 Companies of the Foot Guards of His Majesties Regiment, and the Generals Regiment of Guards, were drawn up in Hide Park in an excellent Order and Equipage, where His Majesty accompanied by His Royal Highness and His Highness Prince Rupers was pleased to take a view of them, where were also present His Highness the Prince of Tuscany, with several of the Ambassadors and foreign Ministers, residing in this Court.
