Cádiz, *Octob. 11. N. S.*

This day all the Cannon of this Place were discharged, and other demonstrations of Joy made for the King of Spain's Recovery. The *Canterbury* Galley, Captain *John Wood* Commander, came in here yesterday from *Tripoly*, having on board an Envoy from that Government to the King of England, who carries with him a Present of *Barbary* Horses, Antelopes, and Ostruches, for His Majesty; And this Frigate, with the rest of the *English* Squadron Commanded by Captain *Munden*, will sail to *England* in 4 or 5 days. The *French* Men of War which was left here by the *Marquis de Nesmond*, when he sailed from hence with his Squadron, is gone out to cruize against the *Moors* of *Sally*, so that there are not at present any *French* Men of War in this Port. An Advice-Boat arrived here the 28th of the last Month from the *Havana*, and brought an Account, that several things have happened, which will oblige the *Spanish* Flota that was expected home this year from the *West-Indies* to put off their departure from thence till next Spring.

Coramca, *Octob. 30.* Letters from *Madrid* of the 20th Instant give an Account, that the King of *Spain* is perfectly recovered of his late Illness. The *Joseph* of *Topham*, *James Fendall* Commander, came into this Port yesterday from *Newfoundland*, and sailed this day for *Bilboa*. The *Spanish-Expeditien* Pacquet-boat arrived here two days ago in 48 hours from *Falmouth*.

Mittaw, *Octob. 15.* The King of *Poland's* Forces have repass'd the *Duna* upon a Bridge of Boats near *Kockenbuisen*, and are canton'd on this side the River till their Winter-Quarters are regulated, which 'tis said they are to have in *Courland*, and *Livonia*; The Horse are in a pretty good condition, but the number of the Foot is very much diminished by Sickness. The Town of *Riga* is still blocked up; but the King of *Poland*, before his departure to *Warsaw*, caused a Declaration to be published, That he will not give any Interruption to the Trade of the *English* and *Dutch* Merchants residing there, and that their Ships shall be permitted freely to come in and out of that Port. The King has made Colonel *Bosen* Governor of *Kockenbuisen*, and the *Saxons* are at work to repair the Fortifications of that Place. The General of the *Muscovite* Forces observing upon their March into *Livonia*, that the Inhabitants of the neighbouring Places fled from their Habitations, he caused it to be published, That the Czar would take them into his Protection, upon condition they did remain in their Houses, and that they should be paid in ready Money for the Forage and Provisions they should furnish for the use of his Forces, but that no Quarter should be given to such as should be found running away from their Dwellings, or skulking in Woods. The last Advices from the

Muscovite Camp before *Narva* say, the Czar arrived there the 24th of *September*, and that they were preparing to storm the Town:

Dantzick, *Octob. 22.* Letters from *Mittaw* of the 18th Instant say, the King of *Poland* is returned to *Warsaw* to hold a General Diet; Which is very necessary at this time to settle the Affairs of that Kingdom, and in particular those of the Great Dutchy of *Lithuania*, which are very much disordered by the great Differences and Antimosities that continue between the Houses of *Sapieha* and *Oginsky*, wherein most of the considerable Gentlemen have taken Part on one side or other.

Carelshaven, *Octob. 21.* The Baron *Sparre* sailed from hence two days ago with several *Swedish* Frigats, and about 40 Transport Ships, having on board a considerable Reinforcement for the King of *Sweden's* Army in *Livonia*, and another Transport of about 60 Sail will follow in few days with farther Succours, under the Command of Rear-Admiral *Waterman*; And Directions are given for sending thither Supplies of Men and Ammunition from several other Parts of this Kingdom. So that we hope the King of *Sweden's* Army may in a short time be able to make Head against the *Muscovites*, who according to our last Advices continued the Siege of *Narva*.

Copenhagen, *Octob. 26.* Orders are given to the *Danish* Forces, lately put into the Emperor's Service, to be in a readiness to march at a day's notice. The chief Command of these Troops is given to Prince *Charles*, Brother to the Duke of *Wirtemberg*, and 'tis said they are to be sent by Sea to *Rosock*, and from thence will march to *Saxony*. The King of *Denmark's* Ministers have met several times, to consider of reducing the Forces of this Kingdom, which they have begun to do, by ordering the Regiment of *Glucksbourg* to be broke, and the Soldiers to be incorporated in that of *Livewendal*. The Queen-Dowager's Illness does not prove to be the Small-Pox, as was feared, and she is at present much better.

Vienna, *October 20.* This day the *Turkish* Ambassador had Audience of Leave of the Emperor with the same Ceremonies as were observed at his first Audience; To morrow he is to take his Leave of the President of the Council of War, and the Emperor's Officers are ordered to conduct him as far as *Schwechet*, and to give him an Entertainment at that Place. An Express is dispatched to Count *Otting*, the Emperor's Ambassador in *Turky*, to give him an Account of the *Turkish* Ambassador's departure, that he may order his Journey hither, to as to meet him on the Frontiers, where they are to be exchanged in the usual manner.
