Yesterday the second instant the Primate, of this Kingdom the Arch Bishop of Gnesse came to the Caches dral Church, where met him all the Nobility and Senators, where they heard a solemn Mass, and from thence went to the place about a quarter of a League from the City; appointed and prepared for the Astemblys and began to fall upon the election of their Mareshal or Speaker, but this was for the time diverted by the Prince Lubominsky, who expecting a more full Assembly, caused a proposal to be made of pressing the Oath according to what was resolved the last Session, of making an election according to rests, or any Money that has or may be Joffer'd for their voices! which occasion'd a long debate amongst them, in which not coming to any resolution, the Assembly was ad-journed till the next day.

It was also moved the same day, that the Court Marshale. who was formerly convinced of infamy, might not have any Vote in the Election : but he being a Member of the Se-nate, and of lome reputation amongst them, its believed, this debate may also take up much time to the retarning of

the Election.

Tis generally laid, that before the Affembly Proceed tothe election of a Mareshal, the soldiers shall be ordered to be fent away, that nothing may be objected on that fide a-

gainst the treedom of the Election.

Riga, May 3. This week by His Majesties Order, several Waggons were sent hence under a good Convoy for Arras, with a considerable summe of Moneys to pay off the Workmen imployed in the fortifications of His Majesties Garrisons in the Netherlands.

From Brussels we are informed, that the Constable of Castille and Count Marcin intend to take a view of all their frontiers, and to put them into a posture of desence, and that the Nobility and Gentry press hard for the revocation of the Placards for Conssication of such persons as live from their Estate, which lye within the French jurisdiction, and which are already put in execution upon the Prince de Ligne. The Constable of Castille has also received fresh Orders from the Queen Regent of Spain, so infilt upon their suppression, as being publishe contrary to the agreement made by the Treaty of Aix.
