at Confiantinopio, partly because of the salle Five solz pieces, whose value being lately decryed, and little other Money found amongst them, has eccasioned great complaints and tunules amongst the people, both there and in other parts of the Turkith Empire, but more from the disorder of the fanisaries, who still dissellat the sill management of the publick affairs, and the long absence of the Grand Segnior, threatening to choo'e another to succeed in his room.

By the same thip we are advised, that the Turkish Fleet lye ready to sail at Negroponte for the relief of the Visiers Army, and that the Venetian Fleet lay attending their motions at Millo, and other Islands in the Archipelago, with intentions (if possible) to engage them on the way.

They farther telf us, that four Privat ers of Maltha were put in at Argentiera, having taken two Saichs richly laden from Aleffandrias and that Captain Cardi with some other Christian Privateers, were cruising about those seas, and had seised a Saich laden with Biscuir, intended for Canea.

This last week arrived here the Companies of Foot from Bavaria, all of them of experienced toldiers, with some of thet G. main Companies to the number of above 2000 men, who were disposed of into convenient Quarters, and were yellerday mustered and paid, and may in few days be imbarked upon the Convoy defigned and near fitted up for Candia.

Hague, May 20. A Copy of the Letter which was larely written to the States by the Ditchels of East-Friesland, acquainting them with the Bishop of Munsters threats, has been sent to the Admiralty of Harlingen, who are to inform themselves morefully by the pretentions and intentions of the laid Bishop, and in the meantime, some forces are ordered to march towards the frontiers of Westphalia to reinforto the Garrisons there, and to secure those parts from any sudden violence or invasion.

From Ulufbing we are told of, the arrival there of severablishes from the French Islands in America but without their Liding; the French West-India Company liaving it seems ordered that mone but French ships shall be penalted to Frade to or from these their Plantagions.

Neither our Letters from the Coasts of Spain on Portugal mentioning a second engagement of Captain, Stanfors with the Corlairs of Algiers, we as yet suspend our belief of that report.

Paris, May 22. By the way of Vienna are lately arrived Letters from Monfieur de la Haye His most Christian Majesties Ambassador at the Court of the Grand Segnior at Uariss, bearing date the 6th of the last moneth; informating his said Majesty of what has past in his negotiation there, desiring His Majesties farther Orders; his Letters making no mention at all of the Grand Segniors hurt by a fall, gives us occasion to suspect the truth of that report.

From Venice our Letters confirm to us the news of the great Assault made by the Turks upon Candia, with their extraordinary loss, but without any thriher particulars of that action: moreover, telling us that from Zante they see adviced of the last arrival at Gandia of the, 2500 hurnenburgers, which tis hoped will chable them to designed that place till the arrival of a more considerable succorabut that the chief Visier had been lately recruited with 7000 soldiers which were lande at spina tong a besides 2002. together in abody of an Army, confishing of Twenty five thousand men, and were marching towards the City of Gas-Fire, to divert the Republick of Ventes from the defence of Candia.

Monsieur de Louvoy is gone toutake a view of His Majestis late Conquetts in the Netherlands, he has in a late Letter to Don Quignones, testisyed much dissatistaction at the delays used by the Constable of Castille in not permitting the free passage of the Coal-boats to Conde; adding, that if justice were not speedily done in that points this most Christian Majesty would be forced to obtain it some other way.

This week by His Majesties Order, several Waggons were sent hence under a good Convoy for Arras, with a considerable summe of Moneys to pay off the Workmen imployed in the fortifications of His Majesties Garrisons in the Netherlands.

From Brussels we are informed, that the Constable of Eastille and Count Marcin intend to take a view of all their frontiers, and to put them into a posture of desence, and that the Nobility and Gentry press hard for the revocation of the Placards for Conssication of such persons as live from their Estate, which lye within the French jurisdiction, and which are already put in execution upon the Prince de Ligne. The Constable of Cassille has also received fresh Orders from the Queen Regent of Spain, so infilt upon their suppression, as being publishe contrary to the agreement made by the Treaty of Aix.

The Officers of the Army have Orders to reinforce their Companies, taking in such persons as shall freely offer themselves to His Majethies service.

His Majetty being informed that the Timber of Canada may be useful to him for t'e building of ships, has ordered 800 workmen to be sent thither to be employ'd in felling Trees and building ships upon the place; intending to have a considerable quantity of the same Timber transported to Thoulon for the same sort of imployment. The 20th instant about 4 or 100 young Women were sent away from heace, who are to be, imbarked with some Companies of Food designed for Canada

From Nancy we are informed that the Commissioners of the Prince Elector Palatine and Duke of Lorrain having spent much time in conference at Wissemberg for the composure of the differences between them, but not able to addition them, both Princes are again preparing for their defence, but intend to dispatch hither their Deputies to acquaint His Majesty with their tespéctive pretensions.

Lime, May 12.
