feature throughout his long tour. He is a most inspiring leader and his achievements have been worthy of the greatest praise.

Acting Squadron Leader Richard David CAMPLING, D.F.C (47364), Royal Air Force, No. 7 Squadron.

This officer has completed numerous sorties since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, involving attacks on such targets as Berlin, Leipzig, Brunswick and Stettin. He is an outstanding pilot and captain whose gallant leadership and sterling qualities have been reflected in the fine fighting qualities of his crews. His successes pay an excellent tribute to his determination to bomb his targets with accuracy.

Acting Squadron Leader David Alexander Dunlor, D.F.C. (104431), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 7 Squadron.

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross this officer has participated in numerous sorties, including 4 attacks on Berlin and 3 on Stuttgart. He is a fearless and efficient captain, whose example in the face of the fiercest opposition has been worthy of the highest praise. He has rendered loyal and devoted service.

Acting Squadron Leader Clifford Farrer Westerman, DFC. (Can/J 6650), Royal Canadian Air Force, No 105 Squadron.

As navigator, this officer has completed a very large number of sorties, most of them demanding a high degree of skill and resolution. He has lisplayed exceptional keenness and devotion to duty and his ability to guide his pilot to the target without fail has contributed in a large way to the successes obtained. He has also devoted much time and care to the training of other members of the squadron with excellent results. has set a very fine example to all.

He has taken part in all the squadron's recent attacks on most heavily defended targets in Germany and has fulfilled his wireless duties with exceptional ability. His record is worthy of the greatest praise.

Wing Commander Douglas Joyce EAYRS (26081), Royal Air Force, No. 640 Squadron.

This officer has completed numerous sorties, including 4 attacks on the capital of the German Reich On the last of these, engine trouble

developed on the outward flight and soon the port negines were overheating to a dangerous degree. Nevertheless, this officer flew on to Berlin and made a successful attack. His determination on this occasion was typical of that he has shown throughout his tour.

ing Commander Dudley Thomas Forsyth (Aus 141), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 466 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has taken part in many attacks on strongly defended targets and has displayed a high degree of skill, courage and resolution. One night in January, 1944, he piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Berlin Early on the outward flight the air-speed indicator became unserviceable. A little later, his navigator became deprived of the use of some of his instruments. These difficulties in no way deterred Wing Commander Forsyth who flew on to the German capital and pressed home his attack. He has always displayed the greatest determination to make every sortie a success

Flight Lieutenant Lance Neville Ahern (Aus.402781).
Royal Australian Air Force, No. 112 Squadron.
This officer has completed a very large number of sorties and has invariably displayed a high degree of skill and courage, qualities which have been well illustrated on many recent occasions.
One day in April, 1944, he flew with much distinction in a successful attack on ground targets. The next morning, Flight Lieutenant Ahern led a formation of aircraft in an attack on shipping during which an enemy motor vessel was tunk. The same afternoon he led the squadron in an engagement against a number of fighters, 3 of which were shot down. By his inspiring leadership and outstanding determination, Flight Lieutenant Ahern contributed materially to the successes obtained. successes obtained.

ying Officer Arthur Gordon PLUMMER (Can/J 14032), Royal Canadian Air Force, No 420 (R C A.F.) Squadron. Flying

One night in March, 1944, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Stuttgart. When some 200 miles from the target one engine failed and the aircraft lost much height. Although he knew that he would arrive at the target after the main bomber force, Flying Officer Plummer flew on to Stuttgart and pressed home a successful attack. His determination to complete his allotted task in the face of much difficulty set an excellent example example

Pilot Officer John Douglas Mortimer (172572), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 100 Squadron

One night in April, 1944, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed for a mine-laying mission. On the return flight the aircraft was attacked by a Junkers 88. The first burst of machine gun fire Junkers 88. The first burst of machine gun fire from the enemy's guns caused considerable damage to the tail planes and the ailerons. The tail trimming gear was wrecked, the hydraulic system was rendered useless, whilst one engine was set on fire Considerable height was lost but Pilot Officer Mortimer regained control. Although the enemy continued to attack with much persistence. Pilot Officer Mortimer manœuvred his badly damaged aircraft with great skill and finally evaded the attacker, afterwards flying safely to base. This officer displayed praiseworthy courage and determination and his skill was undoubtedly responsible for the safe return of the aircraft and its crew its crew

On the outward flight, Flight Sergeant Blockley sighted a fighter coming in to attack and promptly warned his pilot. Coolly and skilfully, Flying Officer Sinclair manœuvred to a good position from which Flight Sergeant Blockley delivered a burst of machine gun fire which hit the enemy aircraft, causing it to explode. Flying Officer Sinclair then resumed his course to the target and executed a successful attack. This officer and airman displayed much skill and excellent co-operation and proved themselves to be valiant members of air-They have completed many sorties. craft crew
