Warsaw, Nov. 12. N. S.

THE Cardinal Primate, and the other Senators that are in Town, have had divers Meetings, at some of which the King of Poland was present; And we hear 'tis resolv'd, that the Meeting of the General Diet shall be put off till the middle of February next. The Sient *Lezinsky*, General of Great Poland, is returned hither from his Embassy at Constantinople, and has given the King an account of his Negotiation; The Crown-General is shortly expected from Lemberg. An Ambassador is coming hither from the Czar of Muscovy, who after he has finished the Business he is to Treat about at this Court, is to go with the same Character to Berlin. The Letters from *Lithuania* give an account, that the Affairs of that Province are in very great disorder, through the continuance of the Differences between the Houses of *Sapieha* and *Oginsky*; The latter being at present the strongest, has ruined the Estate belonging to General *Sapieha*, who has obtained of the Crown-General an Assistance of 2000 Men of the Forces of the Crown, and is going to attack *Oginsky's* Party, so that it grows every day more difficult to put an end to these Disturbances.

Riga, Novemb. 12. The Saxon Forces in these Parts are all gone into Winter Quarters, which the greatest part of them have taken in the Duchy of *Courland*; and before the weather will suffer them to come into the Field again, it may very reasonably be hoped, that Matters will be accommodated between the Kings of *Sweden* and *Poland*, seeing the latter seems already to have a Jealousie of the Designs of the *Muscovites*. Our Advises concerning the Siege of *Narva*, come to us for the most part by such ways, as make them very uncertain; But the last Account we have, is, that the Town held out still, and that the King of *Sweden* made all the haste he possibly could to relieve it.

Copenhagen, Novemb. 23. Orders are given to the Commanders of the Forces in the Service of this Crown, to recruit their Regiments. General *Cormailon* is made Governor of this City. The Field-Marshal *Wedel* arrived here three days ago from *Norway*, and waited upon the King of *Denmark*, to give him an Account of the State of the *Danish* Forces in that Kingdom. A Placact was Published here this day, to Prohibit all the Subjects of *Denmark* from serving on board the Privateers, who cruize in the East-Sea with Commissions from the King

of *Poland* against the *Swedes*; And 'tis said, another Placact will shortly be published, to forbid the said Privateers from coming into any Ports or Harbours in the King of *Denmark's* Dominions. The Heer *Van Jessen* will part from hence this week on his Embassy to the Imperial Court. An Ambassador is expected here in ten days or a fortnight from the Czar of *Muscovy*.

Vienna, Novemb. 17. The Emperor went this evening to *Medling*, about two miles distant from hence, intending to hunt the Wild Boar to morrow in the neighbourhood of that Place. A good quantity of Artillery has lately been sent from *Buda* to *Brisac*, *Fribourg*, *Philipsbourg*, and other Places on the *Rhine* belonging to the Emperor, and 'tis said, some Forces will be ordered to march thither to strengthen those Garrisons. There have been great Rejoicings in all the Emperor's Dominions for the Birth of the young Prince, Son to the King of the *Romans*. The *Turkish* Ambassador continues his Journey towards *Salankemen*. Several Perions, Subjects to the Emperor, who were going in his Train to *Turkey*, are stopt at *Buda* by order of the Governor of that Place. The Imperial and *Turkish* Commissioners have agreed upon the Boundaries of *Transilvania*, but meet with several Difficulties in settling the Limits of the *Upper Hungary*. Just now an Express arrives here from *Madrid*, with the News of the King of *Spain's* Death, and of the Will he made in favour of the Duke of *Anjou*.

Dresden, Nov. 19. A Body of 7500 *Danes*, under the Command of Prince *Charles of Wirtemberg*, are shortly expected here from *Holftein*, and Orders are given to provide Quarters for them in this Country. The General Diet of the Electorate of *Saxony* is to meet here the 23d Instant; And the Discourse continues, that the King of *Poland* intends to come hither, to be present in this Assembly. General *Steynan*, the Field-Marshal, is arrived here from *Livonia*, having in his Journey called at the Court at *Berlin*. The Heer *Van Breckhout*, General of Foot, and Governour of this City, is gone from hence towards *Poland*.

Berlin, Nov. 23. The Elector of *Brandenburgh's* Journey to *Prussia* is put off for some time. The Electoral Prince of *Brandenburgh* returned hither some days ago from *Holland*, and the Elector is shortly expected from *Hannover*.

Frankfurt, Novemb. 25. On the 21st Instant there were great Rejoicings in this City for the Birth of the young Arch-Duke, Son to the King of the *Romans*; Publick Thanks were returned in all the Churches, and the Cannon round the Town were several times discharged. We hear, the like has been done at the Court of the Elector of *Menz*, and in all other Parts of the
