HE Cardinal Primate, and the other Senators that are in Town, have had divers Meetings, at some of which the King of Poland was present; And we hear is in ten days reloved, that the Meeting of the General Diet Muscovy. hall be put off till the middle of February next. The Sient Lezinsky, General of Great Poland, is returned hither from his Embassy at Constantimple, and has given the King an account of his Negociation; The Crown-General is shortly expected from Lemberg. An Ainbaffactor is coming hither from the Czar of Muscowy, who after he has finished the Business he is to Freat about at this Court, is to go with the fame Chracter to Berlin. The Letters from Lieling. his give an account, that the Affairs of that Province are in very great diforder, through the continuance of the Differences between the Houses of Sapieha and Oginsky; The latter being at present the strongest, has ruined the Estate belonging to General Sapieha, who has obtained of the Crown-General an Affistance of 2000 Men of the Forces of the Crown, and is going to attack Oginshy's Party, so that it grows every day more difficult to put an end to these Disturbances.

Riza, Novemb. 12. The Saxon Forces in ters, which the greatest part of them have taken in the Dutchy of Courland; and before the weather will suffer them to come into the Field again, it may very reasonably be hoped, that Matters will be accommodated between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, seeing the latter feems already to have a Jealoufie of the Designs of the Muscovites. The Field-Marshal Wedel arrived here three days ago from Norway, and waited upon the King of Denmark, to give him an Account of the State of the Danish Forces in that Kingdom. Vienna, Novemb. 17. The Emperor went this evening to Medling, about two miles diftant from hence, intending to hunt the Wild Boar to morrow in the neighbourhood of. that Place. A good quantity of Artillery has lately been fent from Buda to Brifac, Fribourg, Philipshourg, and other Places on the Rhine belonging to the Emperor, and tis faid, some Forces will be ordered to march thither to firengthen shole Garrisons. There have been great Rejoicings in all the Emperor's Dominions for the Birth of the young Prince, Son to the King of the Romans. The Turkifh Ambassador continues his Journey towards Salankemen, Several Persons, Subjects to the Emperor, who were going in his Train to Turkey, are stopt at Buda by order of the Governor of that Place. The Imperial and Turkish Commissioners have agreed upon the Boundaries of Transitvanis, but meet with several Difficulties in settling the Limits of the Upper Hungary. Just now an Express arrives here from Madrid, with the News of thele Parts are all gone into Winter Quar-the King of Spain's Death, and of the Will he made in favour of the Duke of Anjou.

Dresden, Nov. 19. A Body of 7500 Danes, under the Command of Prince Charles of Wirtenberg, are shorely expected here from Holstein, and Orders are given to provide Quarters for them in this Country. The General Diet of the Electorate of Saxony is to meet here the 23d Instant; And the Discourse continues, that the King of Poland intends to come hither, to be present in this Assembly. General steynan, the Field-Marshal, is arrived here from Limmie, having in his Journey called at the Court at B. rlin. The Heer Van B. rekhout, General of Foot, and Governgt of this City, is gone from hence towards Poland.
