Rome, Nov. 23. N. S.

N Express arrived here the 19th Instant from Madrid, with an Account of the Death of the King of Spain, upon which the Cardina Manught it necessary to hasten the Election of alecope; And the Zealots and Ottoloui's Party joining together, they proposed Albani to the French Cardinals, as a Person acceptable to all Sides; The French answered, They had no Instructions either to Promote or Exclude him, but defired the Election might be deverred till the Prince of Monaco, Amballador from France, Hereupon an Excould be consulted therein. ress was sent to the Ambassador, (who is retired to Quirico, in the Great Duke of Tuscany's Ternitories;) and being returned with the like Answer, Cardinal Albani was this day chosen Pope, and after the Ceremony of the Adoration was performed, one of the Cardinals according to Custom declared his Election to the People from the Window of the Conclave which opens into St. Peter's Place, and that he had taken the Name of Clement the Eleventh. He was made a Cardinal by Pope Alexander the Eighth in 1690, and is aged about Si years. This Election has given great Satisfaction to the Inhabitants of this City. Prince Valuent retired fome days ago to his Principality; wherespon the College of Cardinals published a Declaration, that if he do not furrender himself within a certain time, he shall be looked upon and treated 18 a Rebel and Enemy to the Ecclesiastical State.

Venice, Novemb. 26. The Senate having by feveral Expresses received advice of the King of Spain's Death, and the Disposition of His Will, have fince been frequently assembled; and 'tis said, they have given Orders for Arengthning the Garnsons of their Frontier Places. Signior Duodo, who was going from hence with the Character of Ambassador to the Court of Spain, has put off his Journey for some time. The Prince of Lubomirty, Great Treasure of Poland, is arrived here, in his return from Rome to Warfaw. A Vessel is arrived here from Cefalonia, the Master of thich reports, That he met off Lesins the Ships which failed from this Place some weeks 2go with Supplies of Men and Ammunition for the Lovant, and that they were to be joined off the Gulf of Cattaro by two Venetian Men of War, which are appointed to be their Convoy.

Madrid, Nov. 18. They write from Cadiz, that the departure of the 3 Men of War deligned for the West-Indies, is put off by order of the Regents; and that they had received Advice by the way of Brazila that the Bieta from Bayres Jimes will of Brazile, that the Flota from Baenos dires will

not fail from thence before the next Spring.

Vienna, November 27. The Imperial Court goes into Mourning to morrow for the Death of the King of Spain. Levies are making in the Hereditary Dominions, for recruiting and augmenting the Emperor's Forces. Divers of the Members of the States of the Lower And firia are arrived here, being to affemble together in few days. Deputies are come hither from the Swife Cantons, who have been feveral times in Conference with the Emperor's Ministers, and tis faid they propole a Defensive Alliance with the Empire. The Emperor has appointed the Count Wratislam to be his Envoy to His Majesty of Great Britain, and he will be going for England in 2 or 3 days. Our last Advices from Hangary say, the Turkish Ambassador was expected the 23d Instant at Essek, and that the Count of Staremberg, and several General Officers and other Persons of Quality, were come thither, in order to be present at the Ceremony of the Exchange of the Imperial and Turkish Ambassadors on the Fron-They write from Transilvania, that Counc Rabutin, General of the Emperor's Forces in that Province, had received a Compliment from the Prince of Moldavia, affuring him, that he will contribute all he can to the maintaining of the Peace and good Correspondence between the Subjects of the Emperor and the Grand Signior; And that the Imperial and Turk sh Commissioners continue their Conferences for fertling the Limits, in which they have made already a very confiderable Progress.

Hamburgh, Decemb. 7.
