Work No. 2—An extension of Haldon Pier from the Cant or elbow thereof for a distance of two hundred and thirty-five feet or thereabouts in a westerly direction;

Work No. 2A—A pier commencing at or near the termination of Work No. 2 extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and forty feet or thereabouts and terminating at the seaward end of the existing Haldon Pier;

Work No. 3—A wall on the bed of the Outer Harbour commencing at a point on the east side of Princess Pier fifty-seven yards or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction along the said Pier from the north-west corner of the Outer Harbour and terminating at a point on the west

side of the North Quay eleven yards or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction from the seaward extremity of the said Quay;

Work No. 4—A widening (by means of decking supported by piles in open work construction) of the footpath along the northern end of the Inner Harbour between Vaughan Parade and Victoria Parade.
