Rome, May, 4. On Sun lay last was celebrated with extraordinary Ceremony and Solemnity, the Canonization of the two new Saints, viz. Peter de Atantara, and Mary Magdalen de Pazzi in order whereunto, the Pope met in the Chappel of Siftus the 4th, with all the Princes, Cardina's, Arch-bishops, Prelats, the servants of his houshold; and all the Clergy, Secular and Regular, who in their habits of Ceremony, and Tapers in their hands, went in a folemn Order and procession from thente to St. Peters Church, which was extraordinatily beautified and adorned for that Ceremony, in which procession were carried two Glorious Standards, on which were lively drawn the Pictures of these two Saints. The Ceremonies being ended, and their Ca2 nonization solemnly pronounced, the Quire began the Ti Deum, which was answered without by the sounding of Trumpets and beat of Drums; and the discharge of several Chambers and all the Guns about the Town and Castle of St. Angelo, with the Ringing of Bells and all other Expresfions of Joy, the usual attendants of these Extraordinary Ceremonies.

Venice, May 10 Our late advices from Zante affure us, that the Turks having made three furious assaults upon the Town of Candia, were in all of them beaten off by the great valour and courage of the Defendants, in which, the loss of the Turks could not be computed less, then of 6000 men; that the Visier after so many losses and discouragements has not given over his lopes that he shall yet at the last make himself Master of the place, he has therefore ordered all the labourers about his Camp to be again employed in raising a new Mount and Butery in the place of that which was lately blown up by the belieged, and is fo confidently periwaded of the strength of his Line, that he ordered the Chevalier Aloifio Molind the Wenerian Minister , to be fent for from Canea, to whom he affigned the best Quarter in the Camp, entertaining him with much civility; thewing him all his Works, and afterwards fent him back again into Genea; in the mean time he is much concerned at the long delays of the Grand Segnior in giving him the affiltences he has so long and often preffed for, and has sent fresh Letters to him to let him know, that unless he speedily supply him with such considerable numbers of merrand other

necessaries as he bas formerly demanded, he shall not b able to make good his promise of winning the Town within the time prefixed by him.

The same Letters farther inform us, that the Visier has for the supply of his Army left the Town of Caneavery thinly manned and ill furnisht with necessaries; the whole Gartilon not exceeding Five hundred men, which information the Senate has thought fit to communicate by a Courier Extraordinary to His most Christian Majesty, with other Letters to their Ambassador at Paris to press that Court to haften away the succours intended for their affistance.

We are lately affured that his Electoral Higness of Brandenburgh has shown his readiness to joyn his affellance with other Princes against the Common Enemy; and has defigned 2000 men for that fervice which are already upon their

Vienna, May 11. By Letters from Monsieur Cafa nova His Imperial Majesties Resident in Turky, we are informed, that the Grand Segnior hasordered an Army of about 100 thoufand merr to be drawn to their Rendezvous upon the Dánube, the greatest part of the said force being thought to be

intended to march into Da'matia.

From Hungary we are informed that the Town of Offen has been lately ruined and almost wholly destroy'd by fire, with all their Magazines of Stores and Ammunition. We have great hopes that the Emperour's Commissioners at Egeries may so well acquit themselves of their Negotiation there, as to put an end to all differences and disputes with the people of Upper Hungar; and to fatisfy them in all their pretentions. The Emperour has ordered the Castle of Neutra to be well fortified, and Garrison'd for the security of

The Trade of the Levant-Company is much augmented, every Moneth four or 5 ships sailing upon their account; laden with Merchandiles for Turky, the faid Company expect daily the arrival of several Boats richly laden at Belgrade, with 10000 Oxen which they have bought in
