Venice, Dec. 4. The Publick Rejoinings for the Election of the new Pope have lasted 3 days, and Te Deum has been sung ir all the Churches of this City upon this occation. The Schatechave sent Orders to the Captain-General Geneimo Gornaro, who is now in the Morea, to return hither with most of the Venetian Galleys, and 3000 Foot of the Foreis in that Country; And Orders are sent to General Materian who commands the Venetian Troops in Dalmatia, to send hither 3000 Horse. The Commanders of the Frontier Places in the State of Venice, are ordered to keep their Magazines well stored with Provisions and Ammunition, and its said new Levies will be made to reinforce the Garissons. All hands are at work, to repair the Damage which the Fortifications of the Lida, and other Publick Buildings, have suffered by the late great Flood. We hear; that at the same time this Misfortune happened here, the Town of Chiosa, about 24 miles from hence, sustained great Damage likewise by the overslowing of the Sea.

Steckholme, December 7. Seweral Regiments of Horse and Foot are raising in this Kingdom, which the Officers are to have compleat by the beginning of March. The advices from Finland say, the Sweaish Forces in that Province, to the number of about 20000, are drawing together in order to give the Muscoviter a Diversion, by miking an Excitation into the Garr's Territories.
