For Diffolving this prefent Parliament, and De-claring the Speedy Calling another.

Hereas We have thought fit for divers Important and Weighty Considerations here. Advice of Our Privy Council, to Dissolve this resease Parliament, which now stands Prorogued to Thursday the Sixteenth of January next; We do for that end Publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and h harty Diffolve the faid Parliament accordingly; And the Loris Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights. cuives and Burgesses of the said Parliament, are Distanged from their Meeting upon Thursday the said Sistemb Day of January. And to the Intent Our and Subjests may Perceive the Considence We have in thir Affection, and how desirous We are to Meet Our Puple, and have their Advice in Parliament, We do body make known to Our faid Subjects, That in re-full of some Matters of the highest Importance to this our Kingdom, We do intend to give Directions to the Kupo of Our Great Seal for the Issuing out of Writs in the Firm of Law, for the Calling a New Parliament, which shall Begin and be Holden at Westminster on Thursday the Sixth Day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Kensington the Nineteenth Day of December, 1700. In the Twelfth Year of Our Reign.

Madrid, Dec. 2. N. S.
