Lubon, Novemb. 18. N. S.

N Express arrived here some days ago, with an Account of the King of Spain's Death, and of his Will in favour of the Duke of Anjou; Since which the Councel of State hath been feveral imes extraordinarily affembled, and Orders are given for Recruiting the Forces in the Service of this Crown, and for Lifting several Regiments of the Militia, who are to be disciplined, and kept in a readiness to take Arms when ever there may be occasion. Fisteen Pompuze Merchant Ships are lately arrived bere from the Bay of All-Saints, and we hear that several others, bound home from the same Place, are forced by stress of Weather into Posevedra, and other Ports of Gallicia.

The Pope's Nuncio Venice, Decemb. 11. had this week Audience of the Senate, and delivered a Letter to notifie his Election. The four Ambassadors of Obedience, appointed by the Senate to Compliment him, have not yet fixed any time for their departure, and its thought the Pope will excuse this Embassy, to atoid putting the Republick to so great an Expence. The Letters from Rome say, Preparations are making for the Solemnity of the Pope's Coronation, and that of his taking Poisession of the Church of St. John de Lateran, which are to be performed with great Magnihence. The Cardinals Noailles and Le Camus mend very soon to return to France, and diters other Cardinals are likewise going home. The last Advices from Dalmatia say, the Venetim and Turkish Commissioners had adjusted the Limits near Narenta, and as long as the Sealon did permit, would proceed to regulate the Boundaries between the Provinces of Dalmatie and Servia.

Vicena, Dec. 15. The Emperor's Order, for raifing a Tax of the Hundredth Peny, is publish'd. The new Levies are continued in these Parts with very good Success, and several Regiments are already recruited. They are taising in Hungary 3000 Husars, 4000 Croats, and 3000 Rascians, and they come in to fast, that the Officers do not doubt of having their Numbers compleat in a fort time. The Count of Salenburgh took Possession yester-day of the Office of President of the Imperial Chamber. The Exchange of the Imperial and Turkish Ambassadors was made the 3d Instant at Salankement, and the first of them is to perform a Quarantain before he proceeds farther on his Journey hither. Berlin, Dec. 17. The necessary Preparations e made at Couingsberg for the Elector of Bran-nburgh's Coronation. The Electoral Prince set denburgh's Coronation. out from hence the 15th Instant in order to go thither; and the Elector and Electoress, and the two Margraves Albert Frederick and Christian Lewis, began their Journey thither this day. Tis faid, their Electoral Highnesses and the whole Court will continue in Prussis till March next.

Hamburgh. Decemb. 24. The News we received 3 days ago by a Ship arrived at Lubeck from Revel of the Defeat of the Muscovite Army, is confirmed by another Vessel come to Lubeck from Riga, as also by Letters from Stockholm of the 15th Instant. The Particulars of this great Action are thus related; On the 24th of the last Month the King of Sweden, having before taken a Review of his Army, which consisted of 20000 Regulated Troops, besides the Gentlemen and Militia of Livonia, marched from Wesenberg (where was the General Rendezvous) in order to relieve Narva. The Muscovires had posted two Detachments, the one of 5000, and the other of 15000 Men, to guard two Palles, which they thought the smeds. must force before they could approach their Comb. But the King being informed thereof Camp; But the King being informed thereof, took another way, and got between the Czar's Camp and the above-mentioned Detachment of 15000 Men, who were posted nearest to it On the 27th, the Swedes attacked the faid 15000 Muscovites, and routed them. The next day was spent by the Swedes in publick Devotion. The 29th, the King continued his March, and being advanced near the Czar's Camp, drew up his Army, and giving to General Welling the Command of the Right Wing, himself took the Left; His Cannon played upon the Enemy's Retrenchments about the Emperor, and 'tis said he is to have the Chief Direction of the Military Affairs. the Enemies Camp, and having made way for their Horfe to come up, the Museovites fled, and endea-voured to pass over the Bridge they had built on the River Narve, for the Communication of their Forces that attacked the Town with those that lay before the Fort of Iwanogrod, but crowding together in great disorder, the Bridge broke, and a great number of them were drowned, and those that remained on this side the River threw down their Arms and asked Quarter, which was granted; Among the Prifoners, were the Duke de Croy, General Weyde, Lieutenant-General Hallard, and several other General Officers, and other Persons of Note. The Czar himself was not prefent in this Action, having left his Army some time before. The swedes being become Masters of the Enemy's Camp, found there 70 Pieces of Cannon, 30 Mortars, and 64000 Dollars in Money, and all their Baggage. The Sweder on their fide lost but two Officers of Note, viz. Major-General Blomberg, and Colonel Reybinder; and they found in the Musepoite Camp, Major-General Parkull, and two other Swedish Officers, who were taken Prisoners some time before. The King of Swedin entred into the Town of Narva, and having returned Publick Thanks in the Principal Church for this Victory, passed the River, and marched in pursuit of the Enemy. An exact Account of the loss on both sides, with the farther Particulars of this Action, must be expected in the Letters from the King of Swidn's Camp, which are not yet arrived.

Brussels, Decemb. 24. Sunday the 19th In-stant, being the King of Spain's Birth-day, the Elector of Bavaria and the whole Court quitted upon this occasion their Mourning for the Death of the late King; His Electoral Highness went publickly to the Cathedral Church of St. Michael, where Te Deum was Jung by the Arch-Bishop of Mechlen, and in the Evening there were Fireworks before the Town-Hall, where the King's Picture was placed under a Canopy of State. The Count d'Autel, Governour of the Province of Luxemburgh, has received Orders from the Court of Spain to raile a Regiment of 1500 Men, to be maintained at the Charge of the faid Province, and 'tis faid, the like will be done in the other Provinces of the Spanish Netherlands.

Hague, Dec.28. N.S. The Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality, have complimented the Swedish Ambassador here upon the Relief of Narva, and the Victory obtained by the King of Sweden over the Muscovites; of which the Ambassador has received an Account from Revel, but none yet from the King of Sweden's Camp. The French Ambassador having received Orders from the King his Master, to infilt no longer upon several new Pretensions he made in Relation to the Manner of his Reception, his publick Entry is appointed for to morrow; He will be entertained 3 days in Prince Maurice's House, and will have his Publick Audience the 31st Instant with the usual Ceremonies. The Count de Vratislaw, Envoy from the Emperor to His Majesty of Great-Britain, arrived here yesterday, and will embark for England with the first fair Wind.
