Stockholme, Dec. 18. By divers Letters come from Rewel, Wyborg, and schansternyen, we have received the News of a fignal Victory obtained by the King of Sweden over the Muscovites the 30th of November 1aft, of which they tell these particulars; His Majesty decamped from Weysenberg the 23d, and on the 27th a Detachment from his Army forced an Important Pass ment from his Army forced an Important Pass called Prajoki, guarded by 12000 Muscowites; the 29th his Forces beat the Muscowites from another strong Post about two Leagues from Narva. the 30th, about 10 in the morning, the King attacked the Enamy, who were very strongly Intrench'd, and after a very obstinate Fight of feveral hours, his Majesty broke into their Camp, and put them to an entire Rour; The Muflovites thereupon endeavoured to pass the River, but the Bridge broke under them, and many were drowned, and those that remained on this side, were most of them trod down by the Horse and killed, and the rest made Prisoners.
