SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall (hereinafter called "the Corporation") have made application to the Minister of Health (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1940") to extend by three years the time limited by paragraph (a) of section 7 of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1939 (hereinafter called "the local Act") for the compulsory purchase of lands numbered 21, 23, 35 and 61 on the plans deposited with the bill for the local Act which the Corporation may in the exercise of the powers of section 5 of the local Act appropriate (i) as regards the lands numbered 21, 23 and 35 for the provision of playing fields, public walks and pleasure and recreation grounds and (ii) as regards the land numbered 61 for the purpose of widening and improving streets or the improvement and development of frontages;
