Brussels, January 18. The States of *Brabant* have consented to raise twelve hundred thousand Florins, part whereof is to be employed for repairing the Fortifications of our Frontier Places, and providing Magazines. The Prince of *Nerclaus* went from hence yesterday, with the Quarter-Master *Verbon* to view the Fortifications of the Castle of *Antwerp*, and the neighbouring Forts. The Obsequies of the late King of *Spain* were celebrated this day in our great Church, at which were present the Elector of *Bavaria*, and the Principal Persons of this Court.

Paris, Jan. 22. N. S. The last Letters from *Holland* bringing an Account, that Count *Briord*, the *French* Ambassador, was in a good way of Recovery, the Count *d'Arnaud*, who was named for that Employment, is commanded to deter his departure from hence till farther order; And in the mean time Don *Quiros*, the *Spanish* Ambassador at the *Hague*, is charged with the Business of this Crown. The *French* Forces are in motion towards *Milan*, and 'tis said they will make an Army of 30000 Men: The King of *Spain*, with the two Princes of *France*, arrived the 11th Instant at *Acqs*; From whence they would continue their Journey in a day or two towards *Bayonne*, where they are preparing a Bull Feast, and other Diversions, for the Entertainment of the Court.
