NOTICE BY THE CATERING WAGES COMMISSION OF A PROPOSED WAGES BOARD RECOMMENDATION.

The Catering Wages Commission in accordance with the powers conferred on them by Section 4 of the Catering Wages Act, 1943, hereby give notice that they propose to make to the Minister of Labour

APPENDIX.

CATERING WAGES ACT, 1943.

Recommendation for the establishment of a Wages Board.

The Catering Wages Commission in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 4 of the Catering Wages Act, 1943, hereby make to the Minister of Labour and National Service a recommendation that a wages board be established in respect of the workers to whom the Schedule to this recommendation applies and their employers.

SCHEDULE.

- 1. Subject to paragraph 2 hereof the workers to whom this Schedule applies are all workers employed in Great Britain in a catering undertaking who are employed by the person or body of persons carrying on that undertaking and who are so employed for the purposes of such of the activities of the undertaking as are carried on at an unlicensed place of refreshment or at a central catering establishment, or in the course of a catering contracting business and who are engaged on any of the following work, that is to say:—
- that is to say:—

 (a) the preparation of food or drink;

 (b) the service of food or drink;

 (c) work incidental to such preparation or service;
- service;
 (d) any work performed on or about the premises or place where food or drink is prepared or served including work in connection with any service or amenity provided on or about such premises or place;
 (e) work in connection with any retail sale of goods on premises where the main activity is the supply of food or drink for immediate consumption;

sumption;

(f) transport work;
(g) work performed at any office or at any store warehouse or similar place or at any garage or stable or similar place.

2. This Schedule does not apply to any of the workers specified in paragraph i hereof:—

(I) if their employment in the undertaking is confined to work specified either in sub-paragraph (f) or sub-paragraph (g) of paragraph i hereof or partly to work specified in the said sub-paragraph (f) and partly to work specified in the said sub-paragraph (g), and they are employed by the

person or body of persons carrying on the undertaking mainly on work not in connection with the undertaking;

(2) who are employed for the purposes of any of the activities carried on at an hotel, inn, boarding house, guest house, hostel, holiday camp, club or other similar establishment and who are so employed by the person or body of persons carrying on such establishment, unless fewer than four rooms are ordinarily available at the establishment as sleeping accommodation for guests or lodgers and the worker is employed for the pur-poses of the activities carried on at a place of refreshment where food or drink is supplied mainly for persons who do not reside at the establishment;

(3) who are employed for the purposes of any of the activities carried on at any of the following establishments, that is to say:—

(a) any hospital, nursing home or convalescent home or similar establishment providing accom-modation for the sick, infirm or mentally modation for defective;

(b) any orphanage, children's home, or similar

establishment;

(c) any institution or home where living accommodation is provided for the aged or indigent;

 (\vec{a}) any university, college, school or similar establishment;

and who are employed by the person or body of persons carrying on the establishment, or, in the case of any of the establishments specified in subparagraph (d) hereof, by the person or body of persons carrying on any boarding house which forms part of the establishment;

(4) who are employed by a railway company for the purposes of any of the activities carried on at a railway station or in a railway train;

(5) who are employed for the purposes of any of the activities carried on at a theatre, music-hall or other similar place of entertainment ordinarily used for the public performance of stage plays or variety entertainments, unless the worker is so employed in the course of a cottering contraction than the course of the cottering contraction. in the course of a catering contracting business;

(6) who are employed for the purposes of any of the activities carried on at a travelling stall, barrow or other similar vehicle from which food or drink is sold by an itinerant salesman;

(7) who are employed by the Crown or by a local authority;

(8) who are employed in an industrial or staff canteen undertaking as defined in the Wages Board (Industrial and Staff Canteen Undertakings) Order, 1944.

3.—(1) In this Schedule the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

" catering undertaking " means any undertaking "catering undertaking" means any undertaking or any part of an undertaking, which consists wholly or mainly in the carrying on (whether for profit or not) of one or more of the following activities, that is to say, the supply of food or drink for immediate consumption, the provision of living accommodation for guests or lodgers or for persons employed in the undertaking and any other activity so far as it is incidental or ancillary to any such activity as aforesaid of the undertaking:

to any such activity as aforesaid of the undertaking;

"central catering establishment" means an establishment wholly or mainly engaged in the preparation of food or drink for immediate consumption either at places of refreshment carried on by the person or body of persons carrying on such establishment or partly at such places of refreshment carried on as aforesaid and partly at places where food or drink is supplied in connection with a catering contracting business carried on as aforesaid;

"place of refreshment" means a restaurant,

"place of refreshment" means a restaurant, dining room, cafe, tea-shop, canteen or similar place or a coffee, stall, snack bar, buffet or other similar stall or bar;

similar stall or par;

"unlicensed place of refreshment" means any place of refreshment where intoxicating liquor cannot legally be sold (or supplied, in the case of a club restaurant, dining room, buffet or bar)

for consumption on the premises;

(2) For the purposes of this Schedule, except where the context otherwise requires, the expression catering contracting business includes any business consisting of the supply in a railway train of food or drink for immediate consumption and activities incidental or ancillary thereto, being a business carried on otherwise than by a railway company.
