HE Pope is very much preffed by the Emperor's Ambassador on one side, and by Cardinal Janssen (who now manages at this Court the Affairs of France) and the Spanish Ambaffador on the other, about granting the Investiture of the Kingdom of Naples which gives him much uneasiness, being unwilling to diso-bline either of these Powers. The Imperial Amblige either of these Powers. ballador, in an Audience he had the 20th Instant, delivered a Letter from the Emperor in Answer to the Brief lately fent by the Pope, for offering his Mediation to adjust Matters between the Emperorand the Crowns of France and Spain, wherein his Imperial Majesty commends the Pope's Zeal for preserving the Peace of Italy, but withal acquaints him, that he thinks himself obliged to affert his Right by force of Arms, and hopes the Justice of his Cause will be supported by the Divine Affistance. At Count Lamberg's late departure from hence for Venice, &c. with a Commission from the Emperor, the Pope defired he would inform him of the Sentiments of the several Princes of Italy, whom he was to call upon, concerning the present Juncture of Affairs, and particularly in relation to the French Forces in the Milaneze. Duke of Modena has fent a Message to the Cardinil d'Estres, to desire he will not give himself the trouble of coming to him at this time, feeing he (the Duke) is under an obligation of adhering to the Emperor's Interests. The Duke of Mantua has sent to the Pope, to desire his Advice and Assisance in this difficult Conjuncture, being sollicited with great earnestness, both by the Emperor and France, to admit their Forces into his Territories. A Congregation of State was held two days ago, to confider of the Proposals made by fome Princes of Italy, to enter into a Defensive Allince for their mutual Preservation, but we do not hear they came to any Resolution. Cardinal a' Arquin intends shortly to go from hence to

Milan, Jan. 19. The Prince of Vaudemont has received an Express from the Regents of Spain, who approve of what he has hitherto done in the Administration of this Government, and direct him for the future to do every thing with the Advice and Consent of the French Minister here; They have also added to his Highness's Commission, the Direction of the Affairs of Naples and Sittly, and the Vice-Roys of those Kingdoms have Orders to obey him. The Count de Tiffe and the Marquis de les Balbaces are returned hither from visiting the Frontiers of this State, of which they have given an Account to the Prince of Vaudemont; They viewed the Passes in the Country of Brescia belonging to the Republick of Vinice, and 'tis faid, the Count de Tiffe went inspace with an Engineer as far as Roveredo and the Country of Tirol. Warfaw, Jan. 28. The Senare of Poland have taken the following Refolutions upon the Four Points referred to their Consideration : 1. That the General Diet shall be put off till September next, feeing 'twould not be convenient they should meet, till the Troubles in Liebnania be composed. That the King of Poland be defired to employ his Royal Authority for that purpole, and to go thicher in Person, since his Presence may be great use to effect an Accommodation. . That it be left to the next General Diet, to tonsider how far the erecting of the new Kingdom of Prussia may concern the Republick and Crown of Poland, and of the Means to prevent any Prejudice that may arise thereby; and that in the mean time the Sieur d'Obiausky shall be sent with the Character of Envoy from the King of Poland, to Compliment the new King. 4. That the Queen-Dowager of Poland shall be gratified in her Desire, to continue some time longer at Rome. The King having approved these Refolutions, the Senate separated the 22d Instant, and the King intends very soon to begin his Journey to Lithuania. Monsieur du Hiron, the French Envoy, continues his Endeavours to engage the King of Poland in the Interest of France, but has received no Answer to his Satisfaction, this Court

being rather enclined to the Emperor.

Vienna, Jan. 29. The Imperial Forces designed for Italy, are ordered to begin their March on the 1cth of the next Month. 280000 Dollars are fent to Inspruck, to be employed for their Subliftence; And strict Orders are given, that they pay ready Money for what is fur-nished them by the Country People. It is faid at Court, that Prince Lewis of Baden is to command the Imperial Forces on the Rhine, and that feveral Princes of the Em pire will put confiderable Bodies of Troops into the Emperor's Service.
