On Monday laft the Senate elected the Noble Francess Duodo to command the Convoy which is fitting up, and will in the dayes be ready to put to Sea, laden with great quantities of Ammunition and other Necellaries for Candia ; upon which are to Bezinbetked the Bavarian and other German and Italian forces defigned for than service, which lie ready to be lent on Board; with a confiderable fumme of Moneys for the Pay and Encouragement of the Garrison.

Paris, May 28. On Friday last the Premier Prefident went with teveral of the Deputies of Parliament to attend His Majefty at St. Germains, where in the name of the whole body he made a large and full dicourse containing their Remonfitance against the lase Raid of His Majesty in prejudice of their privited jes, infifting largely,

1. Upon the impossibility of executi g the Code in all its points.

2. Shewing the inconveniencies and ill configuences of his prohibition of all alliances between the Ministers of Juffice.

3. Touching upon the priviledges which this Majefty by the faid Edict would take t on them, and t H

4. Upon the other point of it, preferibing the age of fuch perfons as were to be admitted to the Robey to which His Majefty only anivered, that he would take a kirtle sime to confider of this Remonitrance, and would in little time fighify his farther plealure : His Majefty was plealed allo the next day to give Order to the Premier Prefident, not to thake his Report (according to cuftom) to the Parliaments, but to deferr it till Weinerday, when they fhould alto farther know His plealure upon their Remonstrance.

A fhip lately arriving at 12 Rockelle from the Islands of America, makes no mention of any attempt made by the Vice-Admiral the Count d' Effree upon State Domingo, which infliciently convinces up of the falling of that Report. Leiters from the fail Count inform us, that upon his arrival at Martinego he teiled upon a Dutch thip which he found laden theres, as Frading without permifilion. They having ordered that no foreign thips thall be fuffet'd to Trade to any of the French Plantations without leave.

From Thoulon we are to'd, hat she T3th it flant the Popes Standard was fer upon the French Admirals ship defigned for the Lewant, with much Ceremony and Several volleys of Campon, that the Duke do Navsilles has taken a view of all the vorces defigned for that Expedition, which he finds to confilt of about 8000 able faldiers, and that the Gallies endeavouring to put to fea, were for fome days hindred by tempeftuous weather, their Rondervous being appointed at Corfou, further tailing us, that the start de the would be intreading to follow them by the end of this moneth,

Other Letters advile us, that the Pope has fent three Briefs to the Count de Vivonne, one of them impowring him to Command all the Auxiliary forces in the ablence of Don Vincenzo Rospiglios, and the Duke de Beaufort 5 a second giving him Order for the diffribution of hit indulgences and Medals according to merit 5 and a third-giving him power to fill up all vacant Charges in cale he should atrive at the Higheft Command.

The Prince of Danemark has been lacely visiting the great Work of the Channel in Languedos for an entercourle between the Mediterranean ien and the Ocean, which is much advanced, and about 6000 men daily employ'd in it.

The Council has been pleafed to permit the French to transport Corn out of the Kingdom till Septembar next enfacing, without paying the late imposition fet upon it in all the Ports, and hath exempted the Port of Marsielles from bill forts of Impositions, the better to encourage the Trade between that place and the feveral Ports of Lings.

Parks, June 1. The Court fleens not to be much pleafed with the Parliaments Remonstrance, and the liberty taken by the Premier Prefidens in his Speech to His Majefty upon that fubject; the King has not yet fignify'd his farther pleafure, to them, but 'tis believed will in few days appear in perfon at the Parliament to ler them know his mind upon that and feveral other Edicts which are preparing.

From Thoulon we are informed that the Gallies are pur our to lea, but meeting with ill weather were forced to pue into the Ifle d' Hierers, the men of warmay in few days be in readinels to pue to lea; the Cardinal Duke de Vendefine is lately arrived there to be prefent at the imbarcation of the forces.

From Smizzerland we are adviled, that the Cantons are not yet unanimoufly refolved to adhere to the interest of this Crown, but to quicken them, on Tuelday last the fumme of Ico houland Crowns was fent to Monsheur de Molier out Refident there for the payment of their Perfions.

Our Ministers have earnestly pressed the Constable of Castille to dismits the Boats with Coals, but have as yet nor been able to obtain any other answer, than the promile of ons by Montieur Ituriets, who may withing a fortnight be expecited here, to succeed in the room of Don Hieronimo Quignones, who is to be recalled. In the mean time our Others in the Merberlands are now proceeding to put in execution the Placards for (onfication, and have already began to cut down Woods growing upon the Effaces of the Count de Henin, the Duke deBournonville i and the Governous of St. Omers.

Braiffells, May 31. The Marquils de Lonvoy is by Order from His most Christian Majefly villing the Garrifons of his late Conquest with the Magazines. On Weddnetday last he arrived at Aeth, from whence he by his Letters has invited the best Engineers to attend him, to mordrow he is expected at Charleroy.

On Monday 1aft were lent under a Convoy from hence 26 Waggons laden with Vowder, Bullets, Match and other Watlise Provisions for the supply of our Garrisons of Cambray, Bouthain, and Valencienne.

Seven Walloon Captains are ordered to draw out each of them 100 men out of the Walloon Regiments, and to embark with them for Spain, upon fome of those fhips which arrived the last year with forces from that Kingdome.

The Conflable of Caftitle having been informed of the ill condition of the Harbot of Oftend, by reston of the large quantity of land which has infome measure thoaked it up, has lately confulted about the cleaning thereof, and has ordered a confiderable fum of moneys to be advanced for that Work, whereof the care will be committed to Sir Mark Ognate.

This next week the Conftable intends to depart hence for Antworp and to begin his Progress for the visiting all the principal Parts of his Government.

Yefterday arrived here a Courrier from Spain, informing, that the Defign of raifing a New Regiment of Guards is thill carried on, though with tome opposition from the Grands. That ar yet the affairs of Don Juan are not fully fettled, and that the Queen Regent has made choice of the Marquifs de Caftel Rodrige with tome other perfors of the Council of State, to confider of the affairs of higher confequence, in relation to the Netherlands, and to advile her of the beft method of defending them.

The Elector of Col gne being informed and much incenfed against the people of St. Tron who had affionted his suthority, in a muthous instault killing fome of the Magifraies of the Towny and committed leveral other infoleneles 3 on Friday last drew out of leveral of his neighboring Garrifons a body of about 6 cod mer, and marching in the night, appeared early in the morning before the Towny and by a Trumpet furment'd them to open the Gates and return to their obediences offerwile threatening them with force, and to make his way into the Town with his Cannon; whereuponthey inntediately fubmitted themfelves, opening their Pofts and receiving a ftrong Garrifon g fome of the principal offenders were immediately apprehended, who may in few days receive a punifimment equal to their demerits.

Portfmeuth, May 25. Here are put in by contrary winds two Gallious from Burdcaux laden with Wince, one of them bound for Hambourgh, the other for Amsterdam, and one ship from Lisbonne, laden with Salt and Sugars.

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
