Rome, Febr. 2. N. S.

THE Pope has sent some Troops to Ferrara, to reinforce that Garrison; and has ordered a Levy of 3 or 4000 Men to be made, and intends to take 3000 Switzers into his Service. The Cardinal *Dastalli* Legate of Ferrara, Cardinal *Dada* Legate of Bologna, and Cardinal *Dassi* Legate of Urbino, are ordered to repair to their respective Governments, and to give Directions for the repairing of the Fortifications of the several Places under their Jurisdiction. The Duke of Mantua's Resident is returned to his Master at Venice, with an Answer, That the Pope cannot supply him with the Money he desires to raise Soldiers for the Defence of Mantua. The Pope has sent Credential Letters to Signior *Aquaviva*, to continue his Nuncio at the Court of Spain.

Venice, Febr. 9. This Republick continue to send Reinforcements to their Garrisons of *Terra-Firma*, and to furnish their Magazines with Provisions and Ammunition. The Cardinal *d'Este* has been several times in Conference with the Deputies of the Senate, who were appointed to Negotiate with him, and intends in few days to leave this Place, and to call upon several Princes of Italy, to execute the Commission he has to them from the Court of France. Captain-General *Cornaro*, who returned the 26th past from the *Morea*, is lodged in the *Lazeretto*, where he is to perform a Quarantine of 23 days. The Count *de Lemos*, General of the Gallies of Naples, and divers other Persons of Quality, are come hither to partake of the Diversions of the Carnival.

Genoa, Febr. 6. Several Transport Ships are arrived at *Final*, *Vado*, and *Savona*, with French Forces, both Horse and Foot, designed for the *Milanese*, and more are daily expected.

Warsaw, Febr. 6. The King of Poland designs in few days to go to *Lithuania*, to endeavour to put an end to the Troubles in that Country, where the Confederated Nobility are extremely exasperated against the House of *Sapieha*; and being informed, that their late Proceedings are disapproved both by the King and the Senate of Poland, they have bound themselves in a new Oath to stand by each other, and not to lay down their Arms till their Demands are complied with. The Count of *Walraet*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Prussia, arrived here the last week, and is to have Publick Audience of the King of Poland in 2 or 3 days.

Copenhagen, Febr. 15. The Muscovite Ambassador made his Publick Entry into this City

the 12th Instant, and had yesterday Audience of the King of Denmark. Orders are given for fitting out a Squadron of Danish Men of War. The Prince of *Furstemberg*, Governor of Saxony, has sent a Courier hither, to desire that the 7500 Danish Soldiers, who are now in that Electorate, may take an Oath of Fidelity to the King of Poland, and that a certain time be agreed on for their continuance in his Service.

Vienna, Febr. 9. The new Levies that are made for the Emperor's Service go on with good Success, and the Imperial Commissaries are providing Magazines in the Country of *Tirol*, and on the *Rhine*. Five Imperial Regiments of Foot of 2400 Men each, have begun their march towards Italy, and the rest of the Troops designed for that Service will soon follow; They will make together 20000 Foot, 6000 Horse, and 4000 Dragoons: Four Imperial Regiments are marching to the *Rhine*. In the mean time the Pope's Nuncio at this Court continues his Endeavours, for setting on foot a Negotiation to accommodate Matters about the Spanish Affair, and particularly to procure a Neutrality for Italy. The *Sieur Jessen* is come hither in the Quality of Envoy from the King of Denmark, to demand of the Emperor the Investiture of the Dutchy of *Holstein*, and the Country of *Oldenbourg*, which are Fiefs of the Empire. *Monsieur Daleman* is also come hither with the Character of Envoy from the King of Poland. 'Tis said, the Emperor will shortly send an Envoy to Berlin, to Compliment the King of Prussia. The Count *d'Otting*, since his return hither, has had Audience of the Emperor, and has given an Account of his Negotiations at Constantinople. Letters from Hungary say, the Grand Signior has made *Ibrahim Bassa*, who was his Ambassador at this Court, *Visier of Temiswaer*, and has also put under his Government *Belgrade*, and several other Towns, which depended on the Government of *Buda* when the Turks were in possession of that Place.

Dresden, February 11. The King of Poland's Officers are buying Horses, and raising Recruits for his Saxon Forces. Letters from Warsaw say, the King was on his departure for *Lithuania*, and that after having settled Matters in that Dutchy, he would go to *Courland*, and from thence would come to this Place. The *Sieur Beuchling*, Great Chancellor of Saxony, is expected in few days from Warsaw.

Frankfort, February 16. The Imperialists do provide Magazines at *Philipsburgh*, *Brisac*, and other Places on the *Rhine*. They write from Bamberg, that the Bishop of that Place has sent two Deputies to Vienna, to adjust Matters with that Court, in relation to the Imperial Forces that are to pass through his Country in their march to the *Rhine*. Letters from *Alsace* say, the French are preparing Quarters at *Strasbourg*, and in the neighbouring Places, for a good

good number of Forces, and are getting ready a Train of Artillery at *Strasbourg*. The Count of *Loewenstein*, Envoy from the Emperor, is gone from the Duke of *Wurtemberg's* Court at *Stuttgart* to the Diet of the Circle of *Suabia*, which is assembled at *Ulm*.

Hamburg, Febr. 18. The King of *Prussia* is shortly expected at *Berlin*, where great Preparations are making for his Reception. He has resolved to augment his Forces to 40000 Men, and to that end ordered new Levies to be made. They write from the Country of *Luxembourg*, that the Forces of the Elector of *Hanover*, the Duke of *Coburg*, and the Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel*, have received Orders to be in a readiness to march upon the first Command.

Brussels, Febr. 22. The Dutch Forces that were in *Garrison* at *Aeth*, *Audenarde*, *Courtray*, and *Newport*, marched from thence on Friday and Saturday last towards *Sluyce* and *Sas van Ghent*, being 6 Battalions; But the Orders are not yet issued for the march of the other 16 Battalions that are in *Mons*, *Charleroy*, *Luxembourg*, and *Namur*. The French Forces advance every day towards the Frontiers of *Holland*. Yesterday arrived here the French Regiment of *Maime*, consisting in 2 Battalions, who are to march to-morrow to *Malines*, and the day following to *Liere*. To-morrow three other Battalions are expected here in their way to *Louvain*, and on Saturday 3 Battalions of *Dauphine* are likewise to pass through this City; and the day after, 3 Battalions and 8 Squadrons are to come into *Garrison* here. Orders are given for recruiting the Spanish Regiments in these Countries.

Hague, Febr. 18. On the 13th Instant, Don *Quiros* the Spanish Ambassador received an Express from the Elector of *Bavaria*, with Orders to acquaint the States, that Directions were given for sending home their Troops in the Spanish Netherlands, but we have yet no Advice of their March. The Count *d'Avaux*, Ambassador Extraordinary from *France*, arrived here the 12th Instant; the next day he was with the Pensionary of *Holland*, and the 14th he delivered a Memorial, together with his Credentials, to the States, who appointed Commissioners to enter into Conference with him, and they began the same the 15th; and yesterday the Ambassador delivered a second Memorial to the States. The last Letters from *Brabant* give an Account, that the French Forces are daily expected at *Antwerp*, *Mechlen*, *Louvain*, and *Brussels*. The States have given Orders for raising 15000 Men, for recruiting their Forces now on foot, and adding two new Companies to each Regiment. A Placart is published, to forbid the Exporting of Horses, Corn, and all sorts of Ammunition, out of the United Provinces. The Duke of *Wurtemberg* is gone from hence to his Government of *Sluyce*, and General *Coeckorne* to *Bergenopzoom*.

Hague, February 22. The States-General sent yesterday a Deputation to the Count *d'Avaux* the French Ambassador, to acquaint him, that they have resolved to acknowledge the Duke of *Arjou* for King of *Spain*; upon which the Count *d'Avaux* immediately dispatched an Express to *Paris*. The Letters from *Flanders* give an Account, that the Elector of *Bavaria* had given out Orders for the March of the Dutch Forces at *Aeth*, *Audenarde*, *Newport*, and *Courtray*, and that in pursuance thereof, the said Forces began their March the 18th Instant towards *Sluyce* and *Sas van Ghent*: But we have no Account, that Orders are yet issued for the March of the Dutch Forces out of *Mons*, *Charleroy*, *Namur*, and *Luxembourg*. The Ambassador of *Sweden* residing here has received Letters, advising, that the King of *Sweden* was marching with his Army towards a Body of 40000 *Muscovites*, who lay intrenched on this side *Pleskow*.

Paris, February 23. N. S. The French Forces in *Flanders* move towards the Frontiers of *Holland*, and 5000 Men of the said Forces are entered into the Spanish *Gelderland*, and have posted themselves near *Nimwegen*. Three Battalions of the Regiment of *Picardy* are in *Garrison* at *Antwerp*. The Spanish Netherlands are to raise 28000 Men, Horses and Foot, and the Most Christian King will pay them till the Revenues of *Spain* are in a better Condition. Orders are sent to the several Ports, for fitting the French main Fleet for Sea. The Countable of *Castile*, and the Marquis *de Cassel des Rios*, Ambassadors from *Spain*, had yesterday Private Audiences of the King at *Versailles*.

Deal, Febr. 15. Rear-Admiral *Bombon* came this morning to the *Downes*, and hoisted his Flag on Board His Majesty's Ship the *Winchester*. The *Concord*, Captain *Wesley* Commander, from *Lisbon*; the *Herne*, Captain *Lowe*, from the *Streights*; the *Amelia*, Captain *Tatmin*, from *Cadiz*; and divers other homeward-bound Merchant Ships are lately arrived in the *Downes*.
