With the series of olive all due Encouragement of such Able and Ordinary Seamen, and allo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who service, and remain on Board Our Ships of War in Our Royal Navy, Have thought the series of Our Privy Council, to this bit the Advice of Our Privy Council, to this our Royal Preclamation; And We do kerely braife and Declare, That all such Able and Ordinary tenan, and Able-bodied Landmen, who either since in Ninth Day of the present Month have Entred, or limit Twenty eight Days after the Date of the Our and Presentation, voluntarily Enter themselves, and raise m Board any of Our Ships of War of the First, and Third or Furth Rate, or Tenders belonging to Our Sm. shall receive as Our Free Gift and Royal Bounty, the philose Alwances and Rewards following: (Viz.) Each she seems Thirty Shillings, and each Ordinary Seasus, and she before the said Ships respectively go to he pid to them before the said Ships respectively go to he make the seems and particularly in or about the County London and Westminster. And We do hereby Command and Require the said Seamen and Landmen to repair on Board the respective Ships on which they shall so Enter themselves, and give their Constant Attendance for sitting out to Sea such Ships, as each of them do belong unto. And We are also Graciously pleased to Declare, That Conduct-Money, according to the Practice of the Navy, shall likewise be allowed to such Seamen and Landmen as shall voluntarily Enter themselves, and remain on Board any of Our said Ships, according to the True Meaning of this Our Royal Proclamation. And for Prevention of any Deceit and Abuses, that muy happen by any Person, or Persons, leaving the Ships to which they belong, and entring him or themselves on Board any other of Our said Ships, as aforesaid, in order to the Obtaining of the Bounty-Mony herein before granted; We do hereby likewise Direct, Declare, and Command, That such Seamen, and Landmen, belonging to any of the Ships, or Vessels whatsoever; as shall leave any of the Ships, or Vessels, to which they belong, and Enter themselves on Board any other of Our Ships, in order to the obtaining of the faid Bounty-Mony, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ship, which they shall so leave, but also be severely Punished according to their Demerits.

The Duke of Mantua has not yet left this Place; he has lately been feveral times in Conference with the Deputies of the Senate, and intends to fend the Marquis de Beretti, his First Minister, to the Pope, with some Proposals (as 'tis suppofed) concerning a League to be entred into by

the Princes of Italy.
