hem in that Country, and 400 Wagons are appointed to carry Ammunition thither from Mons. The French Regiment of Joursine, which was in Garrison here, marched the 9th towards Diest. General Scheliche, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, has, fince his Arrival here, The Emperor's been twice with the Elector. Resident is required by this Court to retire from hence, as is likewise the Envoy of the Elector Palatine.

Yesterday the States Hague, March II. fent a Deputation to the Count d'Avanx, Ambailador from France, with an Antwer to his last Memorial, wherein they thank his Most Christian Majesty for the Friendship he expresses for their State; They complain of their Forces being detained at Namur and Luxemburgh; And declare their readiness to begin the Conferences with the faid Ambassador, in Concert with the Ministers of the King of England, and other Potentates, for Establishing the Publick Tranquillity, and their particular Security; And its faid, the first Conference for this purpose will be held on Monday next. Don Quiros, the Spanish Ambaisador, has prefented a Memorial to the States, complaining. That by opening the Sluices near Lillo and Fred.rick-Fort, some Lands belonging to the King of Spain have been laid under Water; and defiring Orders may be speedily given for flutting the faid Sluices, or that otherwise he shall be obliged to demand Satisfaction for the Danages which the Subjects of the King his Master sustain thereby. The States con-Master sustain thereby. tinue to give out Commissions for raising 80 new Troops of Horse, and the other Levies are carried on at the same time. Two thousand Men of the Porces of Lunenburgh are arrived at Swell and Deventer, and 8000 Brandenburghers are shortly expected at Cleves, for the Assistance of this State. All irraginable Diligence is used in fitting out our Fleet. According to the freshest Advices from Flanders, the Dutch Forcess were not yet marched out of Namur or Luxemburgh.

Orders are given for Paris, March 12. N. S. a Detachment of the Troops of the King's Houshold to be in a readiness to march towards Flanders at 24 hours warning; And here is a Dif-course, that the French Court will go to Bruffels towards the latter end of April, or the beginning of May. The Princes of France are to return hither directly from Lyons, without finishing the Progress they at first designed. The Constable of Capile, Ambassador Extraordinary from Spain, will make his Publick Entry here to morrow, and on Monday is to have his Publick Audience of the King in the morning; and in the afternoon-the Court goes to Marly for 8 or 10 days. 'Tis faid, that the King has made the Duke of Saway General of the French Forces in the Mila. nize. Count d'Aversberg, the Emperor's Ambaffador at the spanish Court, is arrived here from Madrid, in his way to Germany. The Sea Preparations in all the Ports of France, are continued with all possible Diligence.
