

hem in that Country, and 400 Wagons are appointed to carry Ammunition thither from Mons. The French Regiment of *Touraine*, which was in Garrison here, marched the 9th towards *Diest*. General *Schelicke*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, has, since his Arrival here, been twice with the Elector. The Emperor's Residence is required by this Court to retire from hence, as is likewise the Envoy of the Elector Palatine.

Hague, March 11. Yesterday the States sent a Deputation to the Count d'*Avaux*, Ambassador from *France*, with an Answer to his last Memorial, wherein they thank his Most Christian Majesty for the Friendship he expresses for their State; They complain of their Forces being detained at *Namur* and *Luxemburgh*; And declare their readines to begin the Conferences with the said Ambassador, in Concert with the Ministers of the King of *England*, and other Potentates, for Establishing the Publick Tranquillity, and their particular Security; And tis said, the first Conference for this purpose will be held on Monday next. Don *Quiros*, the Spanish Ambassador, has presented a Memorial to the States, complaining. That by opening the Sluices near *Lillo* and *Fredrick-Fort*, some Lands belonging to the King of *Spain* have been laid under Water; and desiring Orders may be speedily given for shutting the said Sluices, or that otherwise he shall be obliged to demand Satisfaction for the Damages which the Subjects of the King his Master sustain thereby. The States continue to give out Commissions for raising 80 new Troops of Horse, and the other Levies are carried on at the same time. Two thousand Men of the Forces of *Lunenburgh* are arrived at *Swoll* and *Deventer*, and 8000 *Brandenburghers* are shortly expected at *Crevesin*, for the Assistance of this State. All imaginable Diligence is used in fitting out our Fleet. According to the freshest Advices from *Flanders*, the Dutch Forces were not yet marched out of *Namur* or *Luxemburgh*.

Paris, March 12. N. S. Orders are given for a Detachment of the Troops of the King's Household to be in a readines to march towards *Flanders* at 24 hours warning; And here is a Discourse, that the French Court will go to *Brussels* towards the latter end of *April*, or the beginning of *May*. The Princes of *France* are to return thither directly from *Lyons*, without finishing the Progress they at first designed. The Constable of *Castile*, Ambassador Extraordinary from *Spain*, will make his Publick Entry here to morrow, and on *Monday* is to have his Publick Audience of the King in the morning; and in the afternoon the Court goes to *Marly* for 8 or 10 days. 'Tis said, that the King has made the Duke of *Savoy* General of the French Forces in the *Milanese*. Count d'*Auersberg*, the Emperor's Ambassador at the Spanish Court, is arrived here from *Madrid*, in his way to *Germany*. The Sea Preparations in all the Ports of *France*, are continued with all possible Diligence.
