COAL ACT, 1938.

PURSUANT to paragraph 6 (2) of the Second Schedule to the Coal Act 1938 the Coal Commission hereby give notice that they propose to grant to a lessee the benefit of the right to withdraw support vested in the Coal Commission by virtue of paragraph 6 (r) of the said Schedule so far as the said right applies in relation to any land within an area situate in the Parish of Ebbw Vale in the County of Monmouth indicated by red colour on a plan which is deposited and open for inspection at The Regional Office of the Coal Commission, 31, Charles Street, Cardiff.
