Yefterday the Prince of Orange gave an honourable entertainment to the Zealand Deputies at his hou'e at Hornflardick : the Negotiation of the faid Deputies, with those from the States of Holland are not yer finisht, but 'tig be'ieved may infew days come to a good iffue, especially, upon the affairs relating to the Chamber of Justice, for which purpose the faid States have appointed an A flemitiyon Thunflay next, both for putting an end to this affair which has been so long in agitation; as also to come to fome resolution about the fitting out our men of war, and the recruiting of our Regiments.

The fame day Monfieur de Pompone went privately out of the Town to Rifwich, where he was shortain'd by the States Steward 3 which ended, and all his Train in readinefs, he began to fet forwards towards his publick Entry, being received about half a League from the Town, and attended jace it by the Heers Bootfma and Vander Flotch the States Deputiets, before hin went the Mafter of his Horfex followed by 8 Pages, and after them 6 Genzieman all on horfeback, in an excellent equipage, the followed the Mafter of the Ceremonies his Loach, after whom game the States Coach, and in it the Ambaffalor with the Deputies and Mafter of the Geremonies, followed by three of dhis Excellencies own Goaches, attended by a Train of above 40 Coaches of the Ambaffadors and princcipal perfons about the Town.

The Mogificates of East-Eriefland having had fome jealofies of the Bishop of Munfter, and received from them le veral complaints, have given a Commission to the Heers Cast and Vryberghe 10 examine the faid complaints and to endeavour a Remedy. The Earon de Kiphuifen is suddenly expected here, with a Deputation from Enden and other Cities of "East-Friesland to justify their "Complaints.

From Glent we are informed, that upon an application, 'made by the Sheur Safbourg in the constable of Castille, she two millefactors apprehended for the infolency formetly committed by them at Oudeman, viz. Pierre de Thionville, and Jaques Cordelier now priloners at Ghent are ordered to be delivered into the hands of the Prefident of Fland 75, but as yet 'tis not certainly affirmed whether they shall receive their till in Flanders, or be by the faid Prefident delivered to the Magistrates of Efcluse to proceed with them according to Justice.

Paris fune 4. ⁴ Yetterday his Majefy was pleafed to be prelent at the Exercise of his forces at the Fort St. Sebatian neer St. Germaines, where the whola body was drawn up upon a line, in feveral bataillons, Bach of them having z. pieces of Cannon at the head off them, in which poffure they gave four Vollyes of fhot, with as many difcharges of their Cannow: the Caprains of the Guards in their weekely Turnes performe the Office of Generall, and keepe an open Table.

From Thoulon we are informed that the Galleysare now put out to fea to joyne with those funct out by the Pope for the Reliefe of Candia, and the men of warr, intended for the fame Expedition lye ready to put to fea with the fift faire Wind.

Letters from Flanders confirm to us the news of fome action that has happened between the Gattilons of Ghent and Oudenard, informing us that a Party from Ghent having taken a Citizen of the other place, upon a debt owing to fome spaniards, and upon application refu'ed to releafe hint, the Governour of Oudenard Monfieur de Rochepas wene out with a party of 200 Horfe, and marching towards Ghent, placed 150 of them in Ambulcado behind a hill; fending out the other 50 nearer the Town to take Prifoners, which giving an Allarum to the Town, a party of 150 Horfe were fent out, upon whole appearance the 50 retreated skirmifning, but clofely purfued by the Spaniards; till falling within the ambufh, they were fo briskly Charged, that they were prefently difordered, and moft of them either killed or rakon.

Waymouth, May 26. The 24th inftant touched in this Bay a fhip paffing to the Eaftwards, firing 9 Guns, and is fuppoled to be a thip of North-Tarmouth newly returned from the Eaft-Indics.

Yesterday arrived the Constance of this Port from Virginia, telling us of a Fleet of about 40 fail which are passing up the Channel, most of them Dutch.

Deal, May 28. Yesterday arrived in the Downs two ships from the Estil-Indies, one of them from Bantam laden with Pepper, the other from Surat; with much Cloach and a quantity of Mace with other Sples. Several other ships are also come into the Downs from the Straights and leveral Ports of Spain, one from Lisbonne, one from Mary land, and one from Morlaix.

• Londons May 29. This day being the Aniversary both of His Majesties birth and happy Reftoration, was celebrated here with Bells and Bonfires, and all the usual attendants on a day of publick joy, on which his Highness the Prince of *Iuscany* was pleased to cause a Bonefire to be made in the evening before the Door of his own Lodging, built upon three flages, distributing a large quantity of Wine amogst the people, and concluding the Evening with excellent Fireworks.
