HE Pope has given out Commissions for raising 3600 Foot, and 600 Dragoons; When these Levies are finished, Commissons will be dispatched for raising 3000 Men more; And 'tissaid, the Pope is in Treary with the Popilh Swift Cantons for 6000 Men, and that 3000 of them will be put into Mantua. The Cardinal de Fourbin had Audience the last week of the Pope, and pressed him very earnestly to grant the Jovestiture of the Kingdoms of Naples and Sitho the King of Spain, and proposed an Alliance to be made between the Pope, the Most Christian King, the Vinetians, and other Princes and States of haly, to prevent the Imperial Forces entring into this Country; but the Pope did not give him Satisfactory Answer to either of these Points. Letters from Naples say, the Vice-Roy of that Kingdom, at the desire of the Count de Tesse who commands the French Forces in the Milaneze, has four thither a considerable quantity of Corn, which the People of Naples seem much distatisfied at apprehending such Exportations will recommend a, apprehending fuch Exportations will very much raise the Price of Bread.
