WILLIAM R. Hereas We have been Informed, That John Glover, Alexander Cutting, William Adye and William Clifton, who have hen Charged by the Commons in Parliament Affembled with High Crimes and Misdemeanors, in Endeavouring with High Crimes and raijaemeanors, in Endeavouring by Bribery, and other Corrupt Practices, to procure themselves for several Boroughs of Members to Serve in this project Parliament, do, in Contempt of the Authority of the Hosse of Commons, Abscond, and cannot opprehended: And whereas the said Commons in Parliament Assembled, have humbly befought Us to Issue and Parliament of the Advantage of the said Tohan Ou Royal Proclamation for Apprehending the faid John Glover, Alexander Cutting, William Adye and William Clifton: We therefore (with the Advice of Our Privy Cosmcil) have thought fit to Iffue this Our Ryal Preclamation, hereby Requiring and Commandin all Our Loving Subjects what foever, to Discover, The end Apprehend the Said John Glover, Alexander Cotting, William Adye and William Clifton, wather of them, wherever they may be Found, and to Carry them before the next Justice of Peace or Chief Unifirate, who is hereby Required to Commisthem to th wat Goal, there to remain until they shall be thence dilivered by due course of Law. And We do hereby Require the faid Justice or other Chief. Magistrate, immidiately to give Notice thereof to Our Privy Council, on the of Our Principal Secretaries of State. And We do kereby firially Charge and Command all Our Loring Subjects (as they will answer the contrary at their Perils) that they do not any ways Graceal, but Distret, Take and Apprehend the said John Glover, Alexander Cutting, William Adye and William Clifton to the and show were the Proceeded Clifton, to the end they may be Proceeded against acwing to Law. And We do hereby Promise and Dedere, That we ofoever shall Discover and Apprehend the said John Glover, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, shall Receive, as a Remod, the Sum of One kundred Pounds; And whoever shall Apprehend and Discover the Said Alexander Cuting, William Adye and William Clifton, or either of them, and bring them before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, shall Receive, as a Remod, the Sum of Fifty Pounds, for each of them so Discover and and Apprehended, which said respective Sums word and Apprehended; which faid respective Sums of One bundred Pounds, and Fifty Pounds, the Commission was of Our Treasury are hereby directed to Pay ac-Whingly.

Count Matton, who, during the lare War against the Turks, served the Republick of Venice in the Quality of Engineer-General, is entred into the Emperor's Service, who has made him Licutenant Field-Marshal-General, with a promise of the Command of the first Regiment that shall become vacant. The Bishop of Olmutz and Olmatrus left this Place the 20th Instant, and is gone to Olmutz.
