TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. ENNERDALE GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934).

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Minister of Fuel and Power by the Ennerdale Rural District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), whose address is The Council Chambers, Cleator, Cumberland, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following (amongst other) purposes (that is to say):—

1. To transfer to and vest in the Council the gas undertaking (hereinafter referred to as "the Saint Bees undertaking") of the Saint Bees Gas Company (1938) Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") upon and subject to the terms and conditions contained in the Order and to confirm and make binding on the parties any agreement or agreements which may have been entered into between the Company and the Council with respect to the purchase and sale of the Saint Bees undertaking and to enact all such incidental and consequential provisions as may be necessary or expedient, including provisions as to debts and liabilities of and moneys due or accruing due to the Company in relation to the Saint Bees undertaking.

2. To extend the limits within which the Council are authorised to supply gas (hereinafter referred to as "the existing limits") so as to include in addition to the existing limits certain areas (hereinafter referred to as "the added limits") to be defined in the intended Order.

To prohibit the Whitehaven United Gas Company Limited from exercising any powers conferred upon them in regard to the construction of gasworks or works connected therewith or the manufacture or supply of gas in the added limits.

3. To empower the Council to exercise within the added limits all or some of the rights, powers, privileges, and authorities which are or may hereinafter be exercisable by them in the existing limits.

4. To empower the Council upon the lands defined in the Order (being land forming the site of the

existing gasworks of the Company) to maintain erect alter improve and renew works for the storage of gas and residual products.

5. To enable the Council to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Order and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas.

6. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

7. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or render inapplicable to the Council all or some of the provisions of the Land Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871 and to extend to the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Ennerdale Gas Order 1939 and any other Act or Order affecting the Council or their gas undertaking.

A description of the areas referred to in paragraph 2 hereof as the added limits and the land referred to in paragraph 4 hereof may be inspected on or before the 14th day of March, 1945, at the offices of the Council as aforesaid and of the under-mentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Minister of Fuel and Power any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Minister of Fuel and Power, New Oxford House, Bloomsbury Way, London, W.C.2, and despatched on or before the 14th day of March, 1945.

Any such objection must state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
