Venice, April 1. N. S.

THE Cardinal *d'Estrees* pressing this Republick for a positive Declaration upon the Instances he has made to them by the Order of the Court of *France*, they have returned him this Answer; That the Republick having considered the present Posture of their Affairs, find they ought to look upon those as their Friends who would not have this State become the Seat of War; and it not being their Part to determine concerning the Reasons for the Proceedings either of the Emperor, or of the Crowns of *France* and *Spain*, they think it just that those Powers should consider the Republick in that State of Friendship which they profess, and that they must always look upon those as Enemies that would bring a War into their Country. The Cardinal has hereupon dispatched a Courier to the *French* Court, and in the mean time, till the Express returns, intends to go and make a Visit to Cardinal *Cornaro* at *Padua*. The Senate having received Advice, That some *French* Troops are advanced near *Peschiera* a Fortress belonging to this Republick, which commands an important Pass on the Lake *di Guarda*, and that they seem to have a Design upon that Place, Orders are sent to *Provveditore Molino* to reinforce the Garrison forthwith, and to go himself thither. They continue to raise Soldiers in the *Venetian* Territories in *Italy*, and the City and Territory of *Bergamo* have offered to raise 3000 Men at their own Expence, *Brescia* 2000, and *Crema* 700. Signior *Grimani*, who was General of the *Venetian* Forces in the *Morea*, is returned hither. Signior *Grimani*, his Brother, is also arrived from *Dalmatia*, having finished his Negotiation for settling the Limits between the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Territories. Some Forces are arrived here from the *Morea*, which are ordered to *Verona*.

Vienna, April 2. The Emperor's Forces, Foot, Horse, and Dragoons, are all actually on their March to *Italy*, except the 4 Regiments of Horse left nam'd for that Expedition, who are to begin their March on the 20th of this Month. The Generals, Count *Guido Staremberg*, *Herberstein*, and *Guttenstein*, are gone to receive and post these Forces as they arrive at *Roveredo*, and Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy*, who is to have the chief Command of the Army, will be going thither in a fortnight. There are 20 Pieces of Cannon sent from *German*, a Place near *Lintz*, towards the general Rendezvous, and the rest of the Artillery designed for this Service, which will make a Train of 75 Pieces of Cannon, are in a readiness here, and will be sent away in few days. Prince *Lewis* of *Baden* having finally settled all Matters with the Emperor's Ministers, in relation to his taking upon him the chief Command of the Imperial Army on the *Rhine*, has desired his Audience of Leave of the Emperor, intending to go first to his House in *Bohemia*, and from thence to *Germany* the beginning of the next Month. He is likewise to have the General Government and Inspection of all the

Places on the *Rhine* which belong to the Emperor; Intendant in Military Matters of the Regency of *Tirol*, under whose Jurisdiction they are. The Duke of *Moles*, Ambassador from *Spain*, is going with the Emperor's Leave to *Nisdorp*, about a league from hence, where he designs to stay till he receives his Revocation from the Court of *Spain*. Count *d'Auersberg* is expected in 2 or 3 days from *Madrid*. Count *Rapach* is appointed to go with the Character of the Emperor's Envoy to the Princes of the Circle of the *Lower Saxony*. The Count *de Paar* is gone from hence to *Berlin*, with a Compliment from the Emperor to the King of *Prussia*.

Francfort, April 10. The Regiment of *Grasnadiers*, and two other Regiments of Foot of the Elector of *Bavaria's* Forces which were in the *Spanish* *Netherlands*, passed by this Place yesterday in Boats, going up the *Meyn* as far as *Wertheim*, from whence they are to march to *Bavaria*, and the other 3 *Bavarian* Regiments are expected here to morrow. They write from the *Upper Alsace*, that several *French* Regiments which were quartered in *Burgundy* are marching towards *Colmar*, near which Place 'tis thought they design to form a Flying Camp, to observe the Imperial Troops in the *Brisgau*. The last Letters from *Switzerland* say, the Cantons are very much sollicitd by the Emperor on one side, and by the Crowns of *France* and *Spain* on the other, to enter into their Interests, but seem rather inclined to a Neutrality.

Cologne, April 12. About 200 Men of the Forces of *Fuderborn* arrived here the 8th Instant, and the next day came in a Company of those of the *Upper Rhine*, and 'tis said our Garrison is to be augmented to 6000 Men. The Elector of *Cologne* has resolv'd to raise a Regiment of Cuirassiers, one of Dragoons, and one of Foot, for the Emperor's Service. They write from *Coblentz*, that the Elector of *Triers* has caused 3000 Men to be Listed in the Archbishoprick of *Triers*, who are obliged to take up Arms whenever they shall be required, and that his Electoral Highness intends, if there be occasion, to put them in Garrison at *Coblentz* and *Ehrenstein*.

Hamburg, April 12. The Sieur *Tettau* is arrived here from *Berlin* in his Journey to *Copenhagen*, whither he is going with a Compliment from the King of *Prussia* to the King of *Denmark*. Letters from *Berlin* advise, that Orders are given for 7 Battalions of Foot, 3 Regiments of Horse, and 2 of Dragoons, of the Forces of *Braundenburg*, to march towards the Dutchy of *Cleves*. They write from *Stockholm*, that the Transport of Forces which are ordered from *Sweden* to *Livonia*, will be ready to be sent away by the middle of *May*; And that these Succours, with the Troops the King of *Sweden* has already in *Livonia*, and with a Body of *Finlanders* who are marching thither, will make an Army of 40000 Men. 'Tis said, a Negotiation is set on foot by the *French* Minister in *Poland*, for accommodating the Differences between the Kings of *Sweden* and *Poland*, and the Czar of *Muscovy*.

Brussels, April 12. The Marquis de Bedmar will be going from hence in few days to view the Fortifications of the Towns in *Flanders*, as he has done already in *Brabant*. The Prince of *Sarcelais* is gone to *Antwerp*, to give Directions for the making of several new Works for the better Security of that Town, as likewise for the making of a Line from the *Scheld* to the *Maeſe* to cover *Lier* and *Dieſt*, and the other Towns on that side, and the Country are obliged to furnish Men to be employed in this work; 1800 Recruits are lately arrived for the *French* Forces in these Parts. They write from *Mons*, that the States of *Hainault* have lately been assembled there, and have consented to a Subsidy of 25000 Dollars, which was demanded of them to recruit and remount the Regiment of the Prince of *Chimay*. 'Tis said, the Fortifications of *Sandoliet* are to be demolished.

Hague, April 15. The Envoy of *Luxemburg* had a Conference this week with the Deputies of the States, to settle Matters in relation to the Forces which the Elector of *Hanover* and the Duke of *Cill* have put into the Service of this State, part of which are already arrived, and put into *Zutphan*, *Nimwegen*, and *Arnhem*. They continue to work with great diligence on the Repairs of the Fortifications of our Frontier Places, and to fill the Magazines. The new Levies go on successfully, and 'tis not doubted but the Officers will have their Companies complete by the time appointed. 'Tis said, a Placart will shortly be published, to forbid the carrying of Horses out of these Provinces under very severe Penalties.

Paris, April 16. N. S. The *French* Forces have, as 'tis said here, so well secured the Passes into *Italy*, that they think the *Germans* will meet with great Difficulties on that side, and that this may make them turn their whole Force upon the *Rhine*; for which reason the Detachment of the Troops of the Household which were designed for *Flanders*, are ordered to march into the *Franche Comte*, and 'tis said, that several Regiments which are at present in *Flanders* will be ordered the same way. The Dukes of *Burgundy* and *Berry* came the 18th past from *Avignon* to *Caderousse*, where they were Complimented by the Parliament of *Orange*; the 29th they lay at *Boulene*, and the next day they arrived at *Montelimor*; They were received on the Borders of the Province of *Dauphine* by the Marquis de *Chabriant* one of the King's Lieutenants of the said Province, and Monsieur *Bouchu* the Intendant, at the Head of a great number of the Gentlemen of that Country; The 31st they came to *Valence*; the Governor and Principal Officers of the Garrison met them without the Town, the Mayor and Echevins received them at the Gate, and the Burghers were in Arms; The next day they were Complimented by the Bishop and Clergy, and by the University of *Valence*. The 4th they came to *Grenoble*, where the Count de *La Roque*, being sent by the Duke of *Savoy* to Compliment them, arrived the same night, and had Audience the next day; the 6th he had Audience of Leave, and returned to *Turin*. The 7th, the Princes were Complimented on the part of the Prince of *Vaudemont* by Signior *Colmenero*, Lieutenant-General of the Artillery in the *Milanese*. The Duke of *Burgundy* is expected at *Verfailles* the 20th Instant, and the whole Court will go to meet him at *Seau*. Letters from *Italy* give an Account, that on the 5th Instant, before break of day, the Count de *Tesse* at the Head of a Body of 14000 *French* Troops possessed himself of the Avenues of the Town of *Mantua*, and sent in a Trumpeter with Proposals to the Duke of *Mantua*, concerning his admitting the Troops of *France* and *Spain* into that Place; and after much difficulty, the Duke agreed to put the Town and Citadel of *Mantua* into the hands of the *French* and *Spaniards*.

Deale, April 7. Sir *Claudeſly Shovel* came this day to the *Downes*, and hoisted the Blue Flag on the Main Top of His Majesty's Ship the *Exeter*. Ten Dutch Men of War came this day into the *Downes* from the Coast of *Holland*.

Whitehall, April 7. This day the Count de *Wratſlaw*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had Publick Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Princess and Prince of *Denmark* being introduced by Sir *Charles Correll* Master of the Ceremonies in the usual manner.
