"Whereas we are satisfied that Newton Lloyd Wade of Newport in the County of Monmouth, Esquire, and Trevor Llewellyn Price of Empire House, Mount Stuart Square, Cardiff, Esquire, as the personal representatives of the late Charles Edward Evans of Nailsea Court, Nailsea in the County of Somerset formerly a Lieutenant-Commander in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Newton Lloyd Wade and Trevor Llewellyn Price desire to transfer the Advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Exeter for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Teigngrace shall be transferred to the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Exeter for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril Forster, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Leake shall be transferred to the said Cyril Forster, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Archbishop of York for the time being."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure 1943, for vesting in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to, or held in trust for, the Bishopric of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Richard Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich was in occupation of the See at the date of the passing of the aforesaid Measure and has requested us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich, who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Richard Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:
