

" And whereas the Bishop is required by the Episcopal Pensions Measure 1926 to pay to us an annual contribution for the purposes of that Measure of £52 10s. 0d.

" Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the 6th day of April 1945, all the endowments, securities or other property described and referred to in the said Schedule shall vest in us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profits thereof upon and from that date:

" And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September and the 31st day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the 30th June 1944 an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,000 and also such sum, not exceeding £500 in any one year, as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop:

" And we further recommend and propose that the annual contribution payable to us by the Bishop, under the Episcopal Pensions Measure, 1926, shall notwithstanding the reduction hereby effected in the stipend of the bishop remain £52 10s. 0d. or such amount as may be fixed by any measure to be passed hereafter in relation to episcopal pension-contributions.

#### " THE SCHEDULE

##### " PART I.

" All that episcopal residence known as The Bishop's House Ipswich together with the Chapel garage workshops and outbuildings and the yards gardens and pleasure grounds and other the appurtenances thereunto belonging situate in the County Borough of Ipswich in the County of Suffolk as the same premises are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged red

##### " PART II.

" (a) The annual payment of £2,550 charged upon our Common Fund by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 2nd day of February 1937 and duly published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of the same month.

" (b) The annual payment of £450 granted to the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey formerly Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich by an Instrument under our Common Seal dated the 1st day of February 1937 and duly published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month and continued to his successors Bishops of the said See by a Resolution passed by us on the 2nd day of November 1939 adopting a Report of our Estates Committee dated the 20th day of July 1939.

##### " PART III.

" All that sum of £1,177 15s. 4d. 3½ per cent. Conversion Stock held by us for the improvement and repair of the Episcopal Residence referred to in Part I of this Schedule.

##### " PART IV.

" All those the fixtures vessels pictures books muniments furniture and other goods and chattels belonging to the Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich in right of his dignity and not in his private capacity and described and set forth in an inventory to be deposited by us in the Diocesan Registry of the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of January, 1945, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for an appropriation to our common fund of a portion of the improved income of the Benefice of Chelsea in the County of Middlesex and the Diocese of London:

" Whereas by a deed dated the 31st day of October, 1944, and made under the Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts certain glebe lands of the said Benefice have been sold in exchange for securities now held by us in trust for the said Benefice:

" And whereas by reason of the said sale the income of the said Benefice has been substantially improved:

" And whereas we are informed that the parish may be included in a reorganisation area under the provisions of the Reorganisation Areas Measure, 1944, and a reorganisation scheme may be proposed for dealing with the endowments of the said Benefice:

" And whereas we are of opinion that a part of the improved income of the said Benefice should be appropriated for the benefit of our common fund pending any arrangements so directed under the said Measure:

" And whereas we have given notice of this Scheme to the Patron of the said Benefice who offers no objection thereto:

" And whereas the Reverend Walter Gordon Arrowsmith, Incumbent of the said Benefice, is consenting thereto, in testimony whereof he has signed the Scheme:

" Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, hereby recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent of the said Benefice in respect of the proceeds of the said sale the annual sum of £2,500 and no more and the balance of the income from the said proceeds shall be appropriated to our common fund:

" Provided, however, that the appropriation herein recommended shall cease and determine either upon the vacation of the said Benefice of Chelsea by the Reverend Walter Gordon Arrowsmith, the present Incumbent thereof, or upon the coming into effect of any reorganisation scheme to be passed relative to the said Benefice under the Reorganisation Areas Measure, 1944, whichever shall first happen."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of Chelsea, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
