Naples, March 15. N. S.

OUR Viceroy having acquainted the Magistrates of this City with the King of Spain's arrival at Madrid, they went in a Body to the Palace to Compliment his Excellency thereupon. Commissions are given out, for raising a Regiment of Neapolitan Horse, and another of Foot, which are to be sent to the Milanese. Orders are given for raising the Militia of this Kingdom, which are to Rendezvous at Capua; and 'tis said, that a Camp of about 6000 Men will be formed this Summer near Berlusa.

Milan, March 23. The Prince of Vandemont, and several General Officers, are gone to view the Fortifications of our Frontier Places, and the Count de Tesse, who is now at Venice, will meet them at Cramona, near which Place they intend to form a Camp. The French have put Soldiers in Solferino and Misolo, and intend to do the same in several other Places, particularly in Berzello and Piadana. Eight French Battalions are marched towards Mantua, and a Treaty is made with the Duke of Mantua for his admitting them into that Place, where they are to remain in Garrison. The Banishment of Prince Rasini, has been attended with that of several other Persons of Note, who too openly expressed their Affection to the House of Austria.

Rome, March 26. The Pope having received Advice, that the French Forces have possessed themselves of Miransola, Guastalla, and several other Places; he has ordered his new Levies to be carried on with all possible diligence, and, to encourage the Officers, has considerably augmented their Pay. Two Companies of Soldiers, raised in the neighbourhood of this City, marched away this week to Ferrara; and all hands are at work in repairing the Fortifications of that Place, and in making the necessary Preparations for the Security of those Frontiers. The Cardinal de Bouillon, who lately went from hence to Turin with a design to return to France, not finding, by the Letters he received there from his Friends at the French Court, any Encouragement to proceed on his Journey, the Pope has writ to him to return hither. The French seem to dislike the Proceedings of this Court, and charge the Pope with Partiality to the Emperor, and are particularly dissatisfied at his refusing to give the Investiture of Naples and Sicily to the King of Spain, and at his concerning himself so much in the Affairs of Cardinal de Bouillon. Several Expresses have lately

passed between this Place and Vienna, and yesterday a Courier from thence brought the Emperor's Answer to a Letter which the Pope lately writ to him, in relation to the present Juncture of Affairs.

Madrid, March 24. Great Preparations are making for the King of Spain's Publick Entry here, which is appointed for the 10th of the next Month, and the Magistrates have resolved to erect several Triumphal Arches upon this occasion. The King gave Publick Audience the 19th Instant to the Envoy of Portugal, the 21st to the Envoy of Parma, and yesterday to Monsieur Schonemberg, Envoy from the States-General of the United Provinces, who, in the Name of the States, Complimented the King upon his Accession to the Crown of Spain. The King has made Don Garcia de Guzman First Master of his Horse; The Government of Buenes Aires is given to Colonel Don Alonzo Valdes, and that of Fimal to Colonel Don Diego de la Concha. The Count de Palma, the new Vice-Roy of Catalonia, is arrived at Barcelona, and has taken a Review of the Forces of that Province. The last Advices from Ceuta say, the Moors are still before that Place, but that their Army is very much weakened, and the Emperor of Morocco is diverted from sending them farther Reinforcements by the War he is engaged in against the Algerines, who have lately given him a considerable Defeat.

Vienna, April 6. The Prince of Darmstadt, late Vice-Roy of Catalonia, is arrived here from Spain, as is likewise Count d'Atersberg, the Emperor's Ambassador at that Court. Prince Eugene of Savoy, General of the Emperor's Forces in Italy, will be going thither in a fortnight or 3 weeks; His Troop of Guards marched the 4th Instant to Newstadt, where they are to continue a few days, and then proceed to the General Rendezvous. The Imperial Forces designed for Italy are on their march, as are likewise the Regiments that are to serve on the Rhine. Count Marsigli, the Imperial Commissioner for settling the Limits between the Territories of the Emperor and the Grand Signior, is daily expected here from Transylvania.

Francfort, April 13. The Elector of Bavaria arrived the 10th Instant at Munich. His Electoral Highness's Troops, which were lately in the Spanish Netherlands, are come into the Neighbourhood of Miltenbourg, where they are to continue till farther order. The Circles of Swabia and Franconia are making new Levies. They write from Switzerland,
