Vienna, April 9. Prince Lewis of Baden continues still here, to adjust some Matters with this Court in relation to his particular Interests 3 He intends to go from hence to his House in Bohemia, and to repair to his Command on the Rhine in the beginning of May. The Emperor's Troops continue their March to Italy, and leveral of the Regiments defigned for this Service are daily expected in our Neighbourhood from Hungary. No day is yet fixed for Prince Eugene of Savoy's departure. The Marquis de Villars, Envoy from France, talks of returning home; and tis faid that tince the Duke of Savor has openly declared hunfelf to be in the Interests of France, his Ambailador will be required to retire from this Court.

Francfort, April 17. The Diet of the Circle of Swabia is affembled at Ulm, and its faid, they have under Confideration the Proposals that are made, in order to an Affociation between them and the neighbouring Circles for their common Security. They write from Ratisbon, that Baron Metternich the King of Pr. fsia's Minister at the Imperial Diet, has received Orders to go to the Court of the Elector Palatine at Duselderp.

Hague, Ap. il 22. The Dutch Garrisons of Mastricht, Nimeguen, and other Places, have received Orders to be in a readiness to march, and 'tis faid two Camps will shortly be formed, the one near Bergenopzoom, and the other near Nimequen. There are at present in this last Place 5300 Men of the Forces of this State. and 1400 Lumenburghers and 6 Regiments more of the Forces of Lumenburgh are shortly expected there.
