THE Letters from *Barbary* give an Account, That the Emperor of *Morocco* was entred with his Army into the Territories of *Algiers*, and that the *Algerines* were marching towards him, so that they were in daily Expectation of a Battle. 'Tis said, that the Cherriff *Muley Ytuyan*, in the Kingdom of *Sus*, has taken this opportunity to Rebel against the Emperor of *Morocco*, and has with him a strong Party; and that *Muley Ytuyan*, one of the Emperor's Sons, is getting together all the Forces he can to march against him.

Vienna, April 13. Prince *Lewis of Baden* having adjusted all Matters with the Emperor's Ministers, in relation to his taking upon him the Chief Command of the Imperial Forces on the *Rhine*, went the 11th Instant to his House in *Bohemia*, and in the beginning of the next Month intends to go from thence to *Germany*. The Imperial Forces continue their march to *Italy*; The Regiments of *Vaudemont* and *Savoy* which come from *Hungary*, are in 2 or 3 days expected in the neighbourhood of this Place, where they will be reviewed by the King of the *Romans*, and afterwards they will proceed to the General rendezvous in the Country of *Tirol*. Prince *Eugene of Savoy*, who is to command the Emperor's Army in *Italy*, will be going thither in 8 or 10 days, and all the General Officers are hastening away. An Officer in the Emperor's Service has been lately seized, and brought Prisoner hither; it's said, some Papers were taken about him, which, among other things, discovered a Design of burning our Magazines at *Tirol*. A Courier is come from *Italy* with an Account, that the Republick of *Venice* being pres'd by the Cardinal *d'Estrees* to give a positive Answer to the Proposals he made to them on the part of the Most Christian King, have declared their Resolutions to observe a Neutrality; And by another Express there is Advice, that the *French* have obliged the Duke of *Mantua* to receive a Garrison of *French* and *Spaniards* into *Mantua*.

Dresden, April 15. Recruits are raising in these Parts for the King of *Poland's* *Saxon* Forces now in *Cowland*. The *Swedes* augment their Forces in *Pomeran*, and seem to have a design of making an Inroad into *Saxony*; The Prince of *Furstemberg* our Governor, upon this Advice, makes the necessary Provision for our Defence, and the King of *Prussia* in such case will assist us with 6000 Men. 'Tis said, the King of *Poland* intends shortly to come hither from *Warsaw*. The Letters from thence ad-

vide, that the King being pres'd by the Deputies of the *Greater Poland*, and of *Lithuania*, to send home his *Saxon* Forces, had promised them, That those which have lately taken Quarters in *Lithuania* shall shortly march back to *Courland*, and that he will send Commissioners to *Wilna* to endeavour to appease the Troubles in *Lithuania*. The Czar of *Muscovy's* Minister at *Warsaw* endeavours all he can to make such an Interest among the Nobility of *Poland*, as that they may at the next Diet consent to the King's carrying on the War against *Sweden*.

Frankfort, April 20. The Electors of *Bavaria* arrived here this day privately from *Bon*, and continued her Journey to *Munich*. The *French* have begun to rebuild the Redoubts, and other Works along the *Rhine*, which they demolished upon the Conclusion of the last Peace; They work with great diligence on the Fortifications of the Town of *New Brisac*, and several Regiments are on their march from the *Franche Comte* and *Burgundy* towards *Alsace*, where they will have a considerable Army this Summer. The Emperor's Forces advance likewise towards the *Rhine*, and the necessary Preparations are made to put *Philipsburgh*, and other Places in those Parts, into a good condition of Defence. Letters from *Baden* of the 17th Instant give an Account, that the General Diet of the *Swiss* Cantons which lately met there, was separated; The Emperor's Ambassador had by a Memorial represented to them, the Emperor's Pretensions to the *Spanish* Succession, and particularly to the Dutchy of *Milan*; proposed to make the same Alliance with the Cantons they had with the late King of *Spain*, in relation to the Dutchy of *Milan*; and offered, in the Emperor's Name, to pay the Arrears that are due to them for the *Swiss* Forces which formerly served in the *Milanese*, amounting to about a Million and half of *Rix-Dollars*, as soon as He is in quiet Possession of that Dutchy; The Deputies of the Diet charged themselves to lay this Memorial before their Principals, and to return with Instructions thereupon at the next Meeting of the Diet, which is appointed to be on the 4th of *May* next. The Marquis *de Casati*, Ambassador from *Spain*, not having yet received any Credential Letters from the new King, the Cantons had let him know, That they could not enter into any Negotiation with him till he presented the same.

Cologne, April 22. Two Companies of Foot of the Forces of the Circle of the *Lower Rhine* came this day into Garrison here. Monsieur *Desalleurs*, Envoy from *France*, went yesterday from *Bon* to *Duiseldorp*. 'Tis said, the Elector Palatine intends shortly to go from *Duiseldorp* to *Vienna*, and that the Electors will remove to *Nieubourg*. They continue to work with great diligence on the Fortifications of *Duiseldorp* and *Fuliers*, and those Garrisons are to be reinforced by the Elector's Forces, which are shortly expected from the Palatinate. Mr. *Stepney*, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, arrived the 18th Instant at *Bon*, where he had Audience of the Elector of *Cologne*; and afterwards continued his Journey to *Vienna*.

Hamburg, April 22. The Duke of *Holfstein Gottorp* arrived here yesterday from *Sleswick*; He intends to continue in this Place 8 or 10 days, and then to go to the Dutchy of *Bremen*; He

He has made Lieutenant-General *Bannier* the Governor of *Tommigen*, one of his Council, and his Commissary-General of War. 'Tis said, that moit of the *Swedish* Forces in the Dutchy of *Biennen* are ordered to march from thence to *Pomeran*. Great Preparations are making at *Berlin* for the King of *Prussia's* Publick Entry into that City, which is appointed to be on the 6th of the next Month. They write from *Hannover*, that Count *Rappach*, the Emperor's Envoy, had Audience of the Elector of *Hanover* the 16th Instant at *Herenhausen*; and that a Regiment of Horse, and another of Foot, of his Electoral Highness's Forces, are on their march to *Holland*. Letters from *Copenhagen* of the 19th Instant give an Account, that Monsieur *Tetteau*, Envoy from the King of *Prussia*, had Audience that day of the King of *Denmark*. That the King will send a considerable Body of his Forces into the Service of the Emperor and the States-General of the United Provinces; and that he intends in the beginning of the next Month to go to *Coldingen*, to review several Regiments of the new-raised Militia, who are ordered to draw together near that Place; and that his Majesty designs to go this Summer to *Norway*.

Hague, April 26. Mr. *Scanhope*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *England*, had this day a Conference with the Deputies of the States-General, who delivered him a Copy of their Resolution, wherein they return their Thanks to His Majesty for his Assurances of Assistance in pursuance of the Treaty of 1677. The States of *Holland* met again this day. The Lord *Raby* arrived here the 24th Instant from *England* in his way to *Berlin*, being sent by His Majesty to Compliment the King of *Prussia*. Monsieur *Spanheim*, who lately came hither from *Paris*, has received Orders from the King of *Prussia* his Master to go to *England*, and to reside there with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary. The Prince of *Nassau Sarbruck* will go from hence in 2 or 3 days to his Government of *Boisduc*.

Paris, April 27. N. S. The Duke of *Berry* arrived at *Versailles* the 24th Instant, and the next day the Court went to *Marly*, where the King intends to continue 4 or 5 days. The Duke of *Burgundy's* departure for *Germany* to Command the *French Army* on the *Rhine*, which was appointed for the 15th of the next Month, is put off to the 20th, and 'tis thought it may be deferred for a longer time. The Marshal *de Boufflers* is appointed to Command the *French Forces* on the *Mæse*; and Lieutenant-General *Rife* is named to Command in *Flanders*. The Count *de Tallard* is returned from his Embassy in *England*, and waited upon the King the 24th Instant: His Majesty has made him a Knight of the Order of the *Holy-Ghost*, and has given him the Government of *Faix* to dispose of to his best advantage; 'Tis worth above 20000 Livres a year, and he will sell it for 40000 Crowns; Upon which he has received the Compliments of all the Court. The Count *d'Avauz* is ordered to return from *Holland*, and 'tis said the Count *de Briand* is to go thither again as soon as his Health will permit it. The Detachments of the Troops of the Household are most on their march towards the *Franche Comte*; The Musketers are to begin theirs on *Saturday* next.
