HE Circular Letters, for Summoning a General Diet of this Kingdom to meet the 30th of the next Month, are fent to the feveral Palatinates; The King therein represents to them the Advantages which his own Forces, though in a small number, have gained in Livoms, by taking feveral Places from the Swedes, and exhorts them to affift him in the War against Sziden, in order to recover the Country of Livewhich formerly belonged to the Crown of Poland, for which the present Conjuncture being very favourable, he thinks himfelf obliged to mike use of it, pursuant to the Outh he took at his Coronation, to endeavour all he could to refore the Republick to its ancient Glory, and Extent of Dominion. The Sieur Pocri, Major-General of Lithuania, came hither fome days ago from that Dutchy, attended by 500 Horse; He his had Audience of the King of Poland, and delivered to him a Letter from the Confederated Nobility of Lithuania, who defire the King nor to pretest the House of Sapieha. The Sieur Szorids, Under-Chancellor of Lithuania, unfwered, That the King recommended it to the Nobility of Libraria to hearken to Terms of Accommodation, and assured them, that notwithstanding the ill Success of the Negotiations that have hisherto ben fer on foot for reconciling the two differing Parties, He will never cease to employ his utmost Endeavours to that end. The Palatinates of Cra-Endeavours to that end. gr and Sendomir have fent Deputies to the King, to desire him to make a Pe ce with Sweden, and to find home his saxon Forces, but they have not yet been admitted to Audience.

Viena, April 20.
