The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry and devotion to duty in the execution of air operations:—

Distinguished Service Order.

Major Newton Francis HARRISON (47481), S.A.A.F., 229 Sqn.

229 Sqn. This officer has a most impressive operational record. In the early part of his service he took part in operations in connection with the Abyssinian campaign. Afterwards Major Harrison participated in many sorties against targets in North Africa, Sicily, Italy, Albania and Yugo-slavia. On his second tour of operational duty, Major Harrison completed a large number of varied sorties during which he led his squadron in harassing attacks on the enemy's lines of com-munication, V weapon sites in the Pas de Calais area and other enemy targets. Throughout these operations much loss has been inflicted on the enemy. Much of the success achieved can be attributed to this officer's splendid leadership, great skill and determination. His devotion to duty has been of the highest order.

Second Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Alfred William Gordon COCHRANE, D.S.O., D.F.C. (N.Z.403429), R.N.Z.A.F., 156 Sqn.

K.N.Z.A.F., 150 Sqn. One night in February, 1945, Squadron Leader Cochrane, as captain of aircraft, was detailed to attack enemy troop concentrations in Goch. Soon after reaching the target the port wing of his air-craft sustained severe damage and part of it fell off. Undeterred, Squadron Leader Cochrane, with superb airmanship and courage, continued with his task. This officer has set a magnificent example his task. This officer has set a magnificent example of fearlessness. His tenacity of purpose and cheerfulness have been an inspiration to his squadron.

Acting Squadron Leader Daniel Bulmer EVERETT, D.F.C. (155223), R.A.F.V.R., 35 Sqn.

D.F.C. (155223), R.A.F.V.R., 35 Sqn. One night in February, 1945, Squadron Leader Everett was pilot and captain of aircraft detailed to attack Goch. Whilst making his first run over the target his aircraft was badly hit. The star-board mainplane was extensively damaged and the starboard inner engine caught fire. Momentarily the aircraft went out of control. Squadron Leader Everett quickly levelled out though and feathered the propeller of the burning engine. The flames were then extinguished. Although unable to assess the full extent of the damage sustained, Squadron Leader Everett went on to several further runs over the target, which he left only after he was satisfied as to the success of the operation. He

afterwards flew the badly damaged aircraft safely to base. This officer displayed a high degree of skill, courage and resolution throughout.

HANBURY, D.F.C. (118400), R A.F.V.R., 305 Sqn. Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Squadron Leader Hanbury has participated in very many sorties. In February, 1945, he took part in a sortie over Germany. After successfully attacking a storage building in the railway sidings at Atterndorf, he also bombed a road/railway bridge. Later, he raked a train with machine gun fire, obtaining numerous hits. After attacking the last named target, Squadron Leader Hanbury had to feather the propeller of one of the engines, which had become overheated. On the return flight his aircraft twice came under considerable light anti-aircraft fire and sustained some damage. In spite of this, Squadron Leader Hanbury flew back to base. He effected a safe landing although both the tyres on the landing wheels had been punctured. This officer has consistently displayed a high standard of skill and courage.

cting Squadron Leader Keith Granville TAYLOR-CANNON, D.F.C. (N.Z.412284), R.N.Z.A.F., Granville Acting 486 (N.Z.) Sqn.

Squadron Leader Taylor-Cannon has participated in a large number of sorties, and has led his flight and often the squadron with skill and determinaand often the squadron with skill and determina-tion, always pressing home his attacks whatever enemy opposition was encountered. The success achieved by the squadron has been mainly due to his brilliant leadership. A typical example of this occurred recently when his formation of seven air-craft was attacked by 30 enemy aircraft. Although outnumbered, Squadron Leader Taylor-Cannon with dauntless courage unhesitatingly led the squadron in to attack. In the ensuing fight he personally destroyed one enemy aircraft of the four brought down by his squadron.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Michael Marlow Julius STEVENS (37132), R.A.F., 106 Sqn.

(37132), R.A.F., 100 Sqn. Throughout his tour of operational duty, Wing Commander Stevens has displayed great deter-mination, skill and courage. He has completed a large number of sorties, including attacks on Konigsberg, Stuttgart, Bremerhaven, Nuremberg and Munich. The good work of Wing Commander Stevens' has contributed materially to the success of the squadron he commands. His attacks have always been pressed home to a successful con-clusion. clusion.

Acting Squadron Leader Robert William Rouviere DAY (Can./C.1459), R.C.A.F., 67 Sqn. Squadron Leader Day is a most determined and

Squaron Leader Day is a most determined and resolute fighter. He has completed a large number of sorties and has invariably displayed the greatest keenness. In January, 1945, Squadron Leader Day led a section of four aircraft in an engagement against six Japanese aircraft. Five of the latter were shot down, two of them by Squadron Leader Day. This officer has shot down at least five enemy aircraft.

Acting Squadron Leader Everett Bryan RogERS (\$1373), R.A.F.V.R., 640 Sqn. This officer has displayed the highest standard of devotion to duty. In spite of several trying experiences in the early years of the war, Squadron Leader Rogers has maintained the greatest zest for air operations. He has now completed a very for air operations. He has now completed a very large number of bombing sorties, involving attacks on a wide range of strongly defended enemy targets. On one occasion, when approaching Sterkrade, a shell burst beneath the tailplane, causing the aircraft to turn completely over on its back and fall towards the ground out of control. Considerable height was lost before Squadron Leader Rogers was able to right the aircraft. After assuring himself that his crew were unharmed, this resolute pilot went on to complete his attack and afterwards flew his badly his attack and afterwards flew his badly damaged aircraft to base. More recently, when detailed to attack Chemnitz, Squadron Leader Rogers showed the same outstanding determination Rogers showed the same outstanding determination to complete his mission successfully. When some distance from the target his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The controls were affected. Although he could only use the trimming tabs to manoeuvre his aircraft, Squadron Leader Rogers continued to the target, which he bombed success-fully. His example of courage and resolution has won great praise won great praise.

won great praise. Acting Squadron Leader George Harold WHOWELL (128986), R.A.F.V.R., 166 Sqn. Dne night in February, 1945, Squadron Leader Whowell captained an aircraft detailed to attack Dresden. Whilst still many miles from the target, the starboard outer engine failed. Squadron Leader Whowell decided to continue his mission and, by a superb display of airmanship, arrived at the target on time to execute a successful attack. Squadron Leader Whowell afterwards flew the air-craft safely back to base and made a successful landing. This officer set a fine example of devotion to duty and his determination was in keeping with that which he has shown throughout his tour with that which he has shown throughout his tour of operational duty.

Flight Lieutenant George Lawry USHER (88251), R.A.F.V.R., 112 Sqn. Flight Lieutenant Usher has completed numerous

sorties on his third tour of operational duty. He has successfully attacked a wide variety of targets, including bridges, rolling stock and an oil tanker. Flight Lieutenant Usher has invariably shown high courage, sound judgment and unfailing devotion to duty.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Lewis Philip BOUCHER

(177902), R.A.F.V.R., 181 Sqn. In February, 1945, Flight Lieutenant Boucher participated in a long range armed reconnaissance over the Dulmen-Hoxtor-Merschede area. Seven goods trains and a locomotive were located west of Merschede, on a section of the railway system sheltered by low hills on either side and defended by anti-aircraft trucks. In the face of the most intense and accurate enemy fire, Flight Lieutenant Boucher led his formation into the attack. Five Boucher led his formation into the attack. Five locomotives were destroyed and three damaged. The tail of his aircraft was severely damaged but Flight Lieutenant Boucher brought it safely to base. Since this action, Flight Lieutenant Boucher has led formations of aircraft on several sorties, during which 15 locomotives have been destroyed and eight more damaged. His leadership has been most inspiring and his courage and devotion to duty have set a fine example to all.

Flying Officer Walter Ross TINKER (N.Z.422078), R.N.Z.A.F., 69 Sqn. This officer, as captain of aircraft, was recently detailed for a night reconnaissance. When com-mencing his reconnaissance his aircraft was sub-jected to intense anti-aircraft fire. By skilful flying Flying Officer Tinker avoided any major damage to his aircraft but the hydraulic system was hit. This caused the bomb doors to remain open and rendered the rear turret unserviceable open and rendered the rear turret unserviceable.

Nevertheless, Flying Officer Tinker continued with his task and completed a successful attack. He then flew his damaged aircraft back to base where, by using the emergency undercarriage gear and without flaps, he executed a successful landing. Flying Officer Tinker has throughout his tour dis-played outstanding courage and the greatest determination played outstanding courage and the greatest determination to complete his missions success-fully. He has set a splendid example to his fully. H squadron.

Flying Officer Edward John TovELL (Aus.414526), R.A.A.F., 299 Sqn. In February, 1945, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack a target in North-West Germany. At one point on the outward flight, the port inner engine exploded and caught fire. The aircraft lost height rapidly and Flying Officer Tovell ordered his crew to prepare to abandon. He succeeded in regaining control, however, and then flew on to the target which he bombed at a much lower level than planned. He afterwards flew back to base and effected a safe landing. This officer displayed great skill, coolness and resolution throughout. He has completed very many sorties against a variety of enemy targets. of enemy targets.

Flying Officer William Alan Liddell TROTT (N.Z.417131), R.N.Z.A.F., 486 (N.Z.) Sqn. This officer has participated in a large number

of sorties, during which he has successfully attacked a variety of enemy targets, including shipping, locomotives and railway coaches, mechanical transport and gun positions. Through-out these operations, Flying Officer Trott has shown the highest standard of skill and courage. His good work has contributed materially to the successes of the squadron. In January, 1945, when returning from a sortie, Flying Officer Trott shot down a F.W.190 which had attempted to machine gun the airfield. Some days later, in a low level attack on a locomotive, this officer was badly wounded in the groin by a piece of shrapnel, which entered the lower abdomen. Although in acute distress, this brave pilot flew more than 100 miles to reach base and land his aircraft safely. He displayed unbeatable determination and fortitude.

Pilot Officer Harold Murray RITTMAN (Aus.410094), R.A.A.F., 683 Sqn. This officer is a most resourceful and deter-mined pilot whose excellent reconnaissance work has proved of great value. He has completed a large number ot missions, involving flights over far distant and well defended targets and has at all times shown the highest standard of devotion to duty. In February, 1945, Pilot Officer Rittman was detailed to reconnoitre the Vienna area. On the outward flight engine trouble developed. Some air speed was lost but Pilot Officer Rittman con-tinued to the target over which he remained for a a lengthy period. The photographs he secured pay a fine tribute to his great skill and perseverance.

1890776 Flight Sergeant Walter Thomas SIMPSON, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 299 Squadron.

Squadron. In September, 1944, Flight Sergeant Simpson was the rear gunner in an aircraft detailed to take part in a re-supply mission to Arnhem. The air-craft was damaged by anti-aircraft fire and the pilot was compelled to make a. forced landing about two miles south-west of Arnhem. The bomber caught fire and the bomb-aimer and flight engineer were trapped in the blazing wieckage. The remainder of the crew managed to get clear but immediately came under rifle fire from enemy snipers. Flight Sergeant Simpson, although under continuous enemy fire and despite the danger of petrol tanks and ammunition exploding, twice entered the blazing bomber and rescued the two members of the crew who were trapped. About 30 seconds later the fuel tanks exploded and the aircraft was soon burnt out. Flight Sergeant Simpson displayed great bravery and disregard of his personal safety in saving the lives of two of his comrades.

of his comrades. 1060048 Corporal Harry GREEN, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, Royal Air Force Regiment. Corporal Green has led his section on patrols against the enemy and has at all times displayed outstanding courage and devotion to duty, quali-ties which have been reflected in the efficiency of those under his command. During the con-centration of the 2nd Polcorps at San Sofia it became essential to discover the precise position of the enemy prior to an attack being made. On the 16th October, 1944. Corporal Green led a patrol detailed to go to Collina Di Pondo. Lead-ing his men on a wide detour, through enemy-held territory, Corporal Green approached his objective from the flank unobserved. As the first building entered by the patrol showed signs of recent occupation Corporal Green went on to the next farm where the enemy were encountered in great strength. The patrol was attacked with grenades and automatics. During this attack a German sentry was killed and other casualties were inflicted on the enemy. Corporal Green, realising that at least one member of his patrol must get back and report the position, directed covering fire to be made on the farm and this enabled the remainder of the patrol to take cover nust get back and report the position, directed covering fire to be made on the farm and this enabled the remainder of the patrol, to take cover in a nearby wood. Although an enemy machine gun was now in action Corporal Green succeeded in withdrawing his men and the patrol returned without a casualty.

1047842 Corporal Tom Squire, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, Royal Air Force Regiment. One morning in November, 1944, Corporal Squire was in charge of his leading section during an attack against the Sugar Factory at Classe Fuori, south of Ravenna. The objective was strongly fortified and the only approach was a single and narrow route which was heavily defended by machine guns. Displaying con-spicuous courage and outstanding determination, defended by machine guns. Displaying con-spicuous courage and outstanding determination, Corporal Squire led his section into the attack. Despite the intensity of the enemy counter-fire, Corporal Squire went straight on to his first objectives and cleared the enemy posts, thereby enabling the remainder of the flight to continue the attack without check. Corporal Squire's courage and determination greatly inspired his comrades and contributed in a large measure to contracted and determination greatly inspired his comrades and contributed in a large measure to the success achieved. He has, on many occasions, led his section on patrols against the enemy. He has invariably displayed fine leadership and has set a magnificent example.

ment. In October, 1944, Leading Aircraftman Davies's unit was at Wamel and was given a section of the front line to hold. The enemy, in strength, were on the opposite bank of the River Waal, roughly one kilometre away. One day orders were given to concentrate full fire power on a factory site known to contain valuable enemy equipment. Artillery support was to be given and it was expected that counter-fire would be received: At 15.00 hours, the bombardment of the enemy position commenced. Shortly after-wards a bomb from one of the mortars failed to leave the muzzle completely and was liable to fall to the ground. Realising the grave danger, Leading Aircraftman Davies, with great presence of mind and complete disregard of his own safety, grasped the bomb and threw it into a pond at the rear of the position. He then immediately continued to fire the morta: and so enabled his team to complete a rapid attack and to withdraw team to complete a rapid attack and to withdraw before counter-fire was brought to bear against them. This airman's courage and sense of duty saved the lives of his colleagues and enabled an important enemy objective to be destroyed.
