Rome, April 23. N. S.

THE Pope held a Consistory the 15th Instant, and afterwards gave Audience to several Cardinals, and to the Imperial Ambassador, who had much Discourse with him about the present Juncture of Affairs, and in particular about the Proceedings of the Duke of Mantua, in receiving a French Garrison into the Town of Mantua at the same time that the Marquis Bentivoglio was treating with the Pope by the Duke's order, for admitting some of his Troops into that State. The Spanish Ambassador intended to have made Publick Rejoicings here for the King his Master's Coronation, and had ordered a Firework to be prepared; but the Pope has thought fit to forbear it, to prevent the Disorders that may happen by so great a concourse of People as might come together on this occasion. The Pope has named Signior Pazzi to go with the Character of his Nuncio to Turin, Signior Bicchì to Switzerland, and Abbot Buffi to Florence; and 'tis believed Abbot Arcenio will be sent as Interuncio to Brussels. The new Levies, and other Preparations for the Security of the Ecclesiastical State, are continued, and the Pope has appointed the Marquis of Melfi to be Commander in Chief of his Forces in the County of Bologna, and Count Palucci to Command in like manner in the Territory of Ferrara.

Florence, April 25. The Great Duke of Tuscany has resolved to augment his Forces, and Commissions are given out for making new Levies. The Great Prince and Prince in end to go from hence in the beginning of the next week to Reggio Calabria, one of the County Houses about 12 miles from this Place. Letters from Naples give an account, that five or six Gallies of that Kingdom, and a like number of the Gallies of the Duke of Tuscany's Squadron, were fitted out in order to carry Releasements to the Spanish Gallies at Porto Linguone, and other Places on the Coast of Tuscany; after which, 'tis said they are to go and join a Squadron of Franco-Man-of-War and Gallies at Port Mahé.

Venice, April 29. We have Advice, that 15000 French, under the command of the Marshal de Camille, are encamped near the River Mantua, not far from Mantua; and that the Prince of Vendôme will find them a Reinforcement of 2000 Spanish Horse, with a Train of Artillery. Part of the German Troops are come to Revelin, where they expect the coming up of the rest of the Army. Signior Fferrari to the Collection of the Dignity of Procurator of St. Mark on Monday last with the usual Solemnity. Signior Corradi, eldest Son to the Procurator, has a Design for the Emperor's Ship for the third Sum of 25000 Ducats. Signior Montoya, Ambassador from the Republick to His Majesty of Great-Britain, desires to be sent to give his Majesty to England. And the Senate have made choice of Signior Nicolo Bisaccini to go their Ambassador to the Court of France. Don Christoforo, Ambassador from Spain, made his Publick Entry the 27th Instant, and had yesterday Publick Audience of the Senate.

Danzick, April 20. Letters from Warsaw give an Account, that the Count de Saxe, Envoy from the Emperor, does very much trouble the King of Poland to make a Peace with Sweden, but that he had not hitherto any success in this Negotiation. The Deputies from the several Palatinates have made Representations to the King in the same effect, and to desire he will find his own Interest out of the Dissolutions of Poland. They write from Constantinople, that the Emperor's Forces are preparing to leave their Quarters, and to march into Livonia. They write from Revelin, that several French Ships were arrived there from Cadix, and that the French Regiments of Foot, and part of the Gilt Companies, are to be sent with the first fair Wind, in order to sail over more than 10000 to carry thither the Duke of Savoy, and the other Ambassadors Officers who are present at Revelin.

Vienna, April 27. Divers Persons have been seized in Hungary on account of the Conspiracy against the Emperor and the King of the Ro-

mans, lately discovered, and others who are accused to have been concerned therein, have made their Escapes; This matter is under farther Examination, and strict search is made after the rest of the Conspirators. The Regiment of Dragoons commanded by Prince Eugene of Savoy, consisting in 12 Troops of 75 Men in each, was reviewed yesterday in the pretence of the Emperor and Empress, the King and Queen of the Romans, and the Arch-Duke and Arch-Duchesses, who were received by Prince Eugene at the Head of the Regiment, which afterwards continued their march to Italy. The Regiment of Mansfeld is expected in 2 or 3 days. Prince Eugene of Savoy intends to go to the Army in the beginning of the next Month.

Frankfort, May 4. The Diet of the Circle of Swabia assembled at Ulm is broke up, having resolved to keep on foot a good Body of Forces, and to make all other Provision for their Security. Count Lowenstain the Emperor's Envoy, passed by this Place yesterday going from Ulm to Dusseldorp; and Count Schlick is gone from hence with a Commission from the Emperor to the Elector of Bavaria. The Garrison of this Place was reinforced this week by two Companies of Foot of the Bishop of Warzburg's Forces. They write from Alsace, that the French continue their Preparations in those Parts, and talk of making a Bridge of Boats over the Rhine near Fort Louis.

Hamburg, May 6. The Elector of Hanover has given out Commissions for raising a Regiment of Horse and another of Dragoons, and the Officers are ordered to have them compleat by the latter end of the next Month. Letters from Courland give an Account, that the Saxon Forces in Livonia are preparing to take the Field, and that they expect to be joined by 30000 Men of the Czar of Muscovy's Forces. The Advices from Stockholm say, several Transport Ships failed from thence the 23d path for Revelin, having on board a Swedish Regiment of Foot; and that the rest of the Swedish Forces designed for Livonia, would be sent away in a short time.

Wesel, May 7. The Regiment of Foot, commanded by the Margrave Philip of Brandenburg, passed by this Place yesterday going to Emmerick, where there is at present a Garrison of 1500 Men. The King of Prussia's Forces in these Parts are cantoned along the Rhine, and 'tis said they will shortly pass over the River, in order to form a Camp, together with the Troops of the Elector Palatine, to cover the Countries of Cleves and Juliers. They write from the Spanish Guelderland, that the French are going to make a Bridge of Boats over the Maese near Venloo.
