6. Derivatives of hydroxy-mercuri-amino-propane, derivatives of hydroxy-mercuri-amino-propylene, and preparations consisting only of a derivative of either of those substances and one or more of the following things, namely, an excipient, vehicle, base or preservative or theophylline.

7. Therapeutic substances intended to be used solely for veterinary purposes, if prepared for use by injection or by application to the scarified skin, the following:

Coryne pyogenes toxoid;
Staphylococcus toxoid;
Swine-fever (crystal violet) vaccine.

Paragraph 1.—Unperfumed ethyl chloride is already exempt from purchase tax.
