**T**HE Prince of *Vaudemont*, our Governor, is still at *Castiglione*, to which Place 'tis said he went to reconcile a Difference that has happened between the Marshal *de Catinat* and the Count *de Tefse*. A Body of 3000 *French* are marched from *Pavia* to *Corno* to secure the Passes on that side, and another of 800 Foot who were quartered at *Novara*, are gone to *Lodi*, where they are to be joined by a *Spanish* Regiment from *Affazaria*. The *Advices* from the Frontiers say, the Imperial Forces are advanced as far as *Riva* and *Torbolo*, two Places situate on the Lake *di Garda*.

*Vinna*, May 7. The Emperor has given a Commission to the Cardinal *Columetz*, Count *Jorger* Governor of the *Lower Austria*, and Count *Otting* late Ambassador at the Port, to enquire into the late Conspiracy, for which purpose they are going in few days to *Hungary*. Orders are sent to the Commanders of the Imperial Forces in that Kingdom and in *Transylvania*, that for the greater Security of those Countries, they forthwith draw together the said Forces in two Bodies of about 10000 Men each, of which the one is to encamp near *Aratz*, and the other near the *Tessle*. Mr. *Stepny*, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, had Audience of the Emperor the 5th Instant. The Imperial Court removed yesterday to *Luxembourg*. The Count of *Dierichstein* is gone from hence to *Italy*, and Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy*, with divers other Officers, are on their departure thither. Most of the Imperial Regiments that are to serve in *Italy*, are arrived on the Borders of *Trent*, and the rest continue their march thither with all possible diligence; Their General Rendezvous is appointed to be near *Rovereto*. The Agent of *Mantua* has received Orders to depart out of this City in 24 hours, and out of the Empire in 10 days; and the Emperor is so much offended with the Duke his Master's Proceedings, that there is a discourse at Court of putting him in the Ban of the Empire.

*Cologne*, May 13. The Ministers of the King of *Prussia*, the Elector Palatine, and the Bishop of *Mainzer*, Directors of this Circle, had several Conferences here this week, in which they resolved to encrease our Garrison to 3400 Men; And they are to meet again the 4th of the next Month at *Dortmund*, to consider farther of providing for the Security of the Circle. Monsieur *Desilleurs*, the *French* Envoy, returned the 13th Instant to *Bon*, not at all satisfied with the Success of his Negotiation: at the Court of the Elector Palatine. Letters from *Dusseldorp* say, his Electoral Highness has given out new Commissions for raising 24 Troops of Horse, and 84 Companies of Foot. They write from *Coblentz*, that the Elector of *Rhine* has given Orders for recruiting his Forces.

*Hague*, May 20. The Courier whom the Count *d'Avaux* lately sent to the *French* Court, is not yet returned. The *French* continue their Preparations in the *Spanish* Netherlands, and work with great Application on the new Lines and Forts they are making on the Frontiers.

The Duke of *Wirtemberg* and General *Coeborn* have been to view *Bergenszoom*, *Breda*, and several other Places, and are since returned to *Sluice*. Divers Barks are lading a considerable quantity of Ammunition at *Dort*, to carry the same to several of our Frontier Towns. The new Levies for the Service of this State, are very near compleated. Two Regiments belonging to the Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel* are marching to our Assistance. The Prince of *Nassaw Weylburgh*, General of the Elector Palatine's Forces, is come hither from *Dusseldorp*.

*Paris*, May 21. N. S. A Second Courier is arrived here from *Sicily*, who confirms the News of a great Disturbance in that Kingdom, and that the Governor of *Messina* was at the Head of the Malecontents in favour of the Emperor. The last Advices from *Italy* say, the Marshal *de Catinat* was preparing to march towards the Frontiers of the *Venetian* Territories, to meet the *German* Forces which advance on that side. The King declared last *Wednesday*, that the King of *Spain* intends to marry the Princess of *Savoy*, and that the Duke of *St. Pierre* is to go with the Character of Ambassador, to demand her in the Name of his *Catholic* Majesty. 'Tis said, the Duke of *Savoy* would not let his Forces march to the *Milaneze* before this Declaration was made; and that the Ceremonies of the Marriage will be performed in a short time, and the Princess will presently after go to *Spain*. Several Persons of Quality at this Court are to be made Knights of the *Golden-Fleece*, and the King intends to give the Order of the *Holy-Ghost* to several Grandees of *Spain*. The King came to *Paris* the 19th Instant, to view a very fine Altar dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, in the Chapel of the Hospital for maimed and decrepid Soldiers called the *Invalides*; Yesterday his Majesty came to the great Church of *Nostrre-Dame*, to gain the Indulgences of the Jubile, which the Pope has lately granted for preserving the Peace of *Europe*; His Majesty viewed the Model of an Altar which *Lewis* the 13th, his Father, made a Vow to build there; but he not living to perform the same, the King has resolved to do it, and has offered a Reward to any Person that shall present to him a Model more perfect than that he has seen. He went from thence to the Palace Royal to see the new Gallery, and afterwards to the Garden of the *Tuileries*, where great Alterations have
