Rome, May 7. N. S.

HE Congregation appointed to examine the Pretentions of the Emperor, and the King of Spain to the Investiture of the Kingdom of Naples, met for the first time the 30th of the last Month, and the Pope made a Speech to acquaint them with the Matters they were to consider of; They have fince had feveral Meerings, and 'tis believed they will shortly come to some Resolution. On the 3d Instant the Pope villed the Queen-Dowager of Poland; She received him at the Gate of her Palace, and kneeling hild his Feet, the conducted him to her Apartment, where an Elbow Chair was placed under a Canopy for the Pope, and the Queen fat on his left hand, and the Princess her Grand-daughter fate upon the Ground on a Cushion. The Pope fived about half an hour, and the Queen conducted him as far as the great Hall of her Palace, and would have waited on him farther, but the Pope would not permit it. The Difference betwen this Court and the Duke of Savey, conceming the Right of Presentation to the Ecclesustical Benefices in Picamont, is not yet adjusted. The Pope continues to provide for the Security of the Ecclefiaftical State; Several Troops of new-raifed Dragoons were fent last week to Forera and Bologna, and Commissions are given out for raising 2 Troups of Dragoons and 10 Companies of Foot more. The Pope's Galkys are ordered to fail to Corfice, to receive on board several Companies of Foot which are railed therefor the Pope's Service, and to bring them to Civita-Vecchia.

Warfaw, May : 6. Count Straa:man, the Emperor's Envoy at this Court, continues his Endeavours to accommodate Matters between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, and is affilted therein by fevenlother Foreign Ministers, but the King of Psiana declines giving them any politive Answer. Stukholm, May 16. The Swedish Forces which were embarked in this Port, confisting of 8000 Foot, failed this week for Livonia, as did likewile 1500 Soldiers from Carelforcone, and other Troops regone on board the Transport Ships provided for them at Carelfbaven, Westerwick, and Norkcoing. The last Advices from Livonia say, the King of Sudar, was still at his Quarters at Lais; but intends, as soon as he has received these Reinforcements, to march towards Pleskow.

Viens, May 18. Mr. Stepney, Envoy Extraor-dinary from His Majesty of Great-Britain, had Andience yesterday of the King and Queen of

the Romans. Colonel Paul Diack is come hither from Hungary, where he has raifed 4000 Hussars for the Emperor's Service, who are to march to Italy. The last Advices from Roveredo are of the 8th Instant, and give an Account, that the Imperial Forces in those Parts were then about 22000 firong, under the Command of Count Guide of Staremberg, and were marching along the Lake de Guarda to possess themselves of a considerable Pass on the River Adige; And that the Venetians, who are thought to be very well enclined to the Emperor's Interest, have drawn together a Body of 15000 Men near Virona. The Count de Solms, Envoy from the King of Prussia, had Audience of Leave last week of the Emperor, and is on his departure to Brlin. 'Tis said, the Marquis de Villors, Envoy from France, intends shortly to return home. Capt. Longueval is to be brought hither in a day or two from Lintz, to give Evidence against Prince Ragozzi, and the other Persons who are accused of the late Conspi.

francfort, May 26. A new-raifed Regiment of Foot, which is put into the Service of the States-General by the Margrave of Anspach, paffed by this Place yesterday, going by water to Holland. The Diets of the Circles of Small and Franconia have ordered their Troops to draw to-gether towards the latter end of the next Month, in order to form a Camp near Hailbron. Deputies from the neighbouring Circles are met here, to confer about providing for their common Security. They write from the Palatinate, that Orders are given for making new Levies of Horfe and Foot for the Elector Palatine's Service. Letters from Alace give an Account, that the Fench continue their Preparations in those Parts; that their Troops are drawing together between New-Brific and the Town of Hemingen; and that they have lately brought 80 Pieces of Cannon into the last of these Piaces, where they are preparing to make a Bridge of Boats over the Rhine.

Cologne, May 27.
