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Venice, May 27. N. S.

**T**HE Emperor's Ambassador presented a Memorial some days ago to the Senate, to acquaint them, That the Imperial Army were advanced to Roveredo, in order to enter into Italy, and that in their passage through the Venetian Territories they would observe a very strict Discipline, and pay for every thing the Country People should furnish them with; And having received an Answer to the said Memorial the 23d Instant, he immediately went to Roveredo, to confer with Prince Eugene of Savoy. Generalissimo of the Imperial Forces. The French have strongly fortified their Camp at Rivoli, and the Palles thereabouts. The Imperialists have employed a great number of the Country People to enlarge the Roads between Roveredo and the Country of Vicenza, which makes it thought they intend to march that way. The Cardinal d'Estrees had at Parma several Conferences with that Duke, who, 'tis said, promised him to observe a Neutrality; after which the Cardinal went to Modena, where he arrived the 18th Instant, and he is expected here in few days. Letters from Naples give an Account, that 8 of the Gallies of that Kingdom, and 7 of those commanded by the Duke of Tarsis, are sailed from thence to join the French and Spanish Squadron at Gibraltar.

**Real, May 9.** Several Swedish Frigats and Transport Ships are arrived here from Stockholm with about 4000 Soldiers, and a greater number are daily expected from Swedjen. The King of Sweden, who is now at his Quarters at Lea, intends very soon to come hither to review these Forces. They write from Schanzen, that the Swedes in those Parts continue to make Excursions upon the Muscovites, and that two Parties which were lately sent from thence into the Enemy's Country, burnt divers Villages and brought back a Muscovite Boyar, and several other Prisoners of Note, with a considerable Booty of Cattel. 'Tis said, the Turks and Tartars make Preparations to besiege Aeg, which would give the Czar of Muscovy a great Diversion.

**Vizna, May 25.** The Imperial Court will return in 3 or 4 days from Luxemburg, to the Palace of Favorita. The Imperial Forces are drawn together at Roveredo, and we expect our next Letters will bring an Account of their being marched into Italy. Several Persons who are Prisoners here upon account of the late Conspiracy, have been Examined; and Count Otting, with the other Commissioners appointed to enquire into this Affair, intends to go in few days to Roveredo to examine Prince Ragozzi, and others

that were lately brought hither. A good number of new-raised Soldiers were sent away this week to Hungary and Transilvania, to recruit the Imperial Regiments in those Parts.

**Frankfort, June 1.** The Elector Palatine intends to lend 10000 Men into the Emperor's Service, who are to be employed upon the Rhine. Two Regiments of the Forces of the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel began their March yesterday from Cassel towards Holland. They write from Alsace, that the Marquis d'Uxelles has reviewed the Militia of that Country, and that a Draught is to be made out of them to recruit the French Forces. Two Regiments of Dragoons are arrived in the Neighbourhood of Strasburgh from the Franche-Comte; 10 Battalions of Foot were to follow in few days, and the rest of the French Troops that are quartered in the Franche-Comte and in Burgundy are shortly expected on the Rhine.

**Cologne, June 3.** The Elector of Cologne has sent some Troops from Bon to reinforce the Garrisons of Reynberg and Keyserwaert; and yesterday his Electoral Highness went to view the Fortifications of those Places. The Garrison of Bon is made up with some new-raised Companies, and with the Militia. The Magistrates of this City have doubled their Guard of Burghers, which is to continue to till the arrival of the Forces of the Circle of Westphalia, which are to remain in Garrison here.

**Hamburg, June 3.** The Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel is come to Bremen, to meet the Queen-Dowager of Denmark, his Sister, who is going to see the Chapel. Two Regiments of the said Landgrave's Forces are marching to Holstein through the Country of Hanover. The two Regiments of Horse and Dragoons that are raising for the Elector of Hanover's Service are almost completed, and Levies are likewise made for recruiting his Forces already on foot. They write from Polna, that the Confederated Nobility of Lithuania are fallen out among themselves, the Conduct of the Sieur Oginsky having disgusted some of the Chief of them, who have formed a considerable Party against him, and that the House of Sapieha hope to make use of this opportunity to regain the Possession of their Estates, and their former Authority in that Duchy. The Saxon Forces are marching from their Quarters in Courland to Kokenhausen in Livonia, which Place is appointed for their General Rendezvous.

**Brussels, June 7.** Monsieur de Pussegave arrived here the 2d Instant from the French Court, and the next day went to Louvain to wait upon the Marshal de Boufflers. The 14th, the Marquis de Bedmar, Monsieur de Bagnols, and the General Officers that were here, went to Louvain, where a Council of War was held; Since which, Orders are given for drawing the French and Spanish Forces into the Field, and the Persons who have undertaken to furnish Horses for the Artillery, are ordered to have them ready by the 10th of this Month. The Prince of Saxe is gone to review the Spanish Foot in Flanders. About 15000 Pioneers are ordered into these Provinces from the French Conquests, and most of them are already arrived at Delft; and they talk of raising 5000 Pioneers more in this Country. The several Provinces of the Spanish Netherlands are ordered to raise each a Regiment of Foot. An Order is come from Madrid, to pay to the Elector of Bavaria out of the King of Spain's Revenues in these Provinces, preferably to all other Payments, the Sum of 100000 Pistoles a year, on account of the Arrears due to him.
